Dear Parishioners:

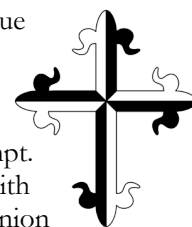
For many of us, we say goodbye to 2020 without any regret. While it has been hard, especially for us Dominican Friars (dealing with a myriad of endless regulations and restrictions), God sometimes allows difficulties to enter our lives. They help purify us; they help us focus on the important things; they help us detach from “what we want” to “what is necessary.” Even for those who are very strong in their Faith, unexpected disruptions in our lives are rarely welcome. It isn’t until we look back with clearer vision, with the trials behind us, that we discover that sometimes these situations were indeed blessings.

While attending Mass and receiving the Sacraments, or even visiting a church, have been challenging, the deprivations this year have perhaps called attention to the needs of our Christians brethren throughout the world. Many Catholics live in areas where they are the minority, where the general population actively persecutes them, where access to even a church or priest is limited or non-existent. It’s at times like this that we can reflect on our own Faith—whether we are angry in not having things the way we want them, whether we have codified our preferences as non-negotiables, whether we feel entitled to certain aspects of our Faith—things that we’ve sometime taken for granted. Recognition is half the battle.

We don’t know when the effects of the pandemic will go away completely, and many people feel that life will never quite return to “the way it was.” Yet change is an important factor in our growth in the Faith. For indeed our Faith is a journey, and it should strengthen over time. At Holy Rosary we friars never failed to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We do so each and every time for the people we serve and for the world in which we live, whether or not there are people physically present. It is our duty and pleasure to do it. So, while it is always better to have our parishioners here worshiping with us, we are still doing God’s work through the liturgy. As restrictions continue to ease (at least for Faith-based communities), please recognize that it is important, by virtue of our baptism, to worship by attending our liturgical services (Mass) where we can.

Communion Guidelines

Because of the larger number of people recently allowed, I ask that people not queue for communion until the last possible minute. Of late, people have joined the line without any sort of distancing between the person in front and the person behind. There is no need to rush and lose sight of these guidelines. As usual, family members may queue together. However, at the altar rail, all individuals space must themselves so as to be no more than 3 per side. Those who need to hold infants and/or toddlers are exempt. We have replaced the rather tacky blue tape with Dominican Crosses at the base of the communion rail. Please kneel in front of these crosses.

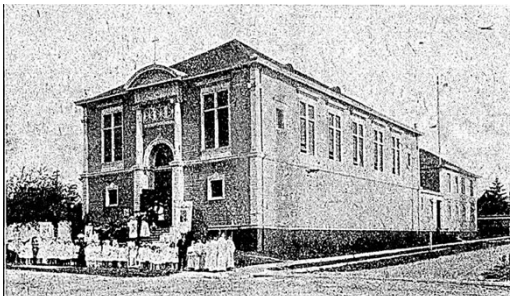
FREE 2021 CATHOLIC ART CALENDAR
