Liturgy In Focus: The Communion Paten



The Communion Paten is modeled after the priest's paten used at the altar during the celebration of Mass. The Communion Paten is distinguished by the attached handle which the server uses to

accompany the distribution of Holy Communion to the faithful.

We are happy to see more of our parishioners return in-person to Masses celebrated in our parishes. With heightened awareness of clean hands, face coverings, and reasonable social distancing, here are some helpful reminders for all of us receiving Holy Communion aided by use of the Communion Paten.

The Communion Paten is placed under the chin of those receiving Holy Communion. As such, it is important to minimize and avoid unnecessary contact, namely with:

- Fingers.** Some place their hands in a praying position with fingers pointed up toward and touching their chin. Please allow some space for the paten. Positioning your fingers forward rather than upward is an easy fix. Placing your hands at your side or below the veil of the communion rail is also a solution.
- Long hair.** For those with shoulder-length hair or longer, please be mindful of hair that tends to fall forward or curve inward. A head tilted up usually does the trick. If your chin is slightly further forward than your nose, then that resolves most hair issues.
- Tongues.** Problems can occur when your tongue sticks out too far or simply not far enough. Ideally, your tongue ought to stick out past your lower teeth while the tip of your tongue rests directly on your lower lip. I assure you that more hand-to-hand contact occurs with Communion on the Hand than happens hand-to-tongue contact occurring with Communion on the Tongue. The host is dry and the tongue is wet. It will stick. And all of your priests have years of target practice. Be at peace.
- Face masks.** Please remove your face mask before receiving communion. A common practice is to lower your face mask so it adheres to or hugs your chin. This works for most. But what does NOT work is loosening only one side of your face mask so that it dangles by one ear. This doesn't allow for a proper placing of the paten underneath the chin and your mask can end up making contact with the paten. And lastly,
- Saying "Amen."** In the Ordinary Form (all of our English Masses are Ordinary Form), it is appropriate that the faithful who are receiving Holy Communion respond with "Amen" to the priest's statement of "The Body of Christ." It is important that if and when you respond with "Amen" that you say it BEFORE the host is placed on your tongue. It doesn't make much sense to say anything while the host is still in your mouth. I have witnessed hosts falling out of mouths because of this. Hence, we use the Communion Paten as a catch-all for
