

Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

The friars and staff have noticed an increase in Mass attendance during the past few months. It is very encouraging to see more Catholics return to church post-covid. One important reminder for us Catholics is that we don't just "go to church," but we go to MASS, the central act of Christian worship, and the spiritual source and summit of all the grace we receive through the Church. In one way or another, all the other sacraments are related to this one. It IS Jesus' saving sacrifice for us. The Mass is, in a sense, all about Jesus. When we offer the Mass, we offer with Jesus, Jesus himself. Through Christ's miraculous action, we are making the same sacrificial, atoning sacrifice as Jesus made. Yes, it is the celebration of the Lord's Supper. But it is also a SACRIFICE. We, therefore, take the "words of Institution" very literally:

Over the Bread: "Take this, all of you, and eat it; this is my body which will be given up for you."

Over the Wine: "Take this all of you, and drink from it; this is

the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me."

St. Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, saw it as more than simply a memorial dinner; otherwise, he would not have said: "Whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord" (1 Cor. 11:27). We also maintain that the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John teaches the same doctrine: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if anyone eat of this bread, he will live forever...he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and...abides in me, and I in him" (Jn. 6:51,54, 56).

As we return to church post-covid, I invite all returning to come prepared to worship God and to offer the Eucharistic sacrifice. Prepare by listening to the word of God attentively, by reading and meditating on the Sunday readings the day before. If you plan on receiving communion, prepare to receive Him worthily, to receive openly the graces our Lord Jesus has for you that day. As Catholics, we are responsible for entering the central act of worship with the right disposition and preparation. If you have not been to Mass in a long time and need to receive the sacrament of reconciliation, the confessional is open a half hour before all weekend Masses.
