

### Dear Parishioners:

#### ST. CATHERINE OF SIENA April 30 | 7:00 PM



Please join us for a Missa Cantata according to the Dominican Rite in observance of the feast of St. Catherine of Siena on Friday, April 30 at 7:00 PM. Liturgical music will be provided by Cantores in Ecclesia. St. Catherine of Siena (1347-1380) was canonized in 1461, made patron of Italy in 1939, and was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Paul VI in 1970. St. Catherine is revered as a powerful mystic and an incomparable woman of action. She is also remembered as a great heroine who, against overwhelming odds, persuaded Pope Gregory XI to leave Avignon and return to Rome. During her lifetime, many were attracted to her human and supernatural qualities, and, as she wrote, the concern of the Dominican community in Siena was to remove hatred from man's heart and "bring him to peace with Christ crucified and with his neighbor." At twenty-eight she received the stigmata, which also remained invisible to others until after her death.


