Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

As we celebrate the fourth Sunday of Easter, our hearts and minds should turn to a much-needed prayer intention: the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. This day is set apart globally to fervently pray for those discerning a call to the priesthood and consecrated life and ask our risen Lord to inspire more to follow this path of devoted service. This Sunday of Easter is also called Good Shepherd Sunday because the Gospel reading traditionally features Jesus as the Good Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep (cf. John 10:11-18). This imagery of Christ as the Shepherd is powerful and resonates deeply with the pastoral care and leadership in the Church.

Holy Rosary Church has been blessed with families who have answered this call through their children. We celebrate and thank those individuals like Fr. John Paul Tomassi, a son of our parish, who was ordained last year and is now an incardinated priest in the Archdiocese of Seattle. His commitment and dedication to God's work remind us of the vibrant spirit and deep faith cultivated within our community.

For parishioners who have a son or daughter called to the priesthood or to the consecrated life, I invite you to share their names with me. It is essential that, as a parish, we uphold them in prayer, seeking God's grace and perseverance for them in their vocations, and for more laborers to work in the Lord's vineyard. I was surprised to learn recently that it has been a long time since the Dominicans have had a vocation to our Western Dominican Province coming directly from Holy Rosary Church; we remain hopeful that in the near future, God will bless us with new candidates eager to embrace this Dominican vocation.

Jesus promised, as recorded in Matthew 19:29, "And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for my name's sake, will receive a hundredfold and will inherit eternal life." This profound assurance applies not only to those who enter religious life but also to their parents and families. Through their sacrifice and support, they gain countless spiritual children and blessings from a life dedicated to God and the Church.

In our efforts to foster and support these vocations, I am excited to announce that this July, our Dominican novices will visit Holy Rosary to share their vocation stories. Stay tuned for more information. Additionally, Fr. John Winkowitsch, our vocations director, will give an insightful presentation on discerning vocation to the priesthood and religious life. This event, part of our "Drinks with Dominicans" series, will occur on July 3rd at 7 pm. It promises to be an enlightening and inspiring evening, and I encourage all to attend.

Parents, I encourage you to nurture an environment where vocations are celebrated and contemplated. Encourage and pray for your children to consider whether God calls them to the consecrated life. This encouragement can shape not only

their future but also the future of our Church.
Let us all commit to pray this Sunday for an increase in vocations and continue to support those who have chosen to walk this path. Together, in prayer and action, we can nurture a thriving, faithful community, answering the Lord's call so that the Church will always have enough shepherds to guide the faithful, similar to how Christ shepherds His flock.
