Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

In his sermon on Easter Sunday, Saint Vincent Ferrer observed that: "Many had risen from the dead to life, both in the Old Testament and in the New, but they did not rise through their own power, but by another's. Christ, however, rose from the dead to life by his own power and not another's, as true God."

More and more, in my experience as a Christian, friar, and cleric, I am struck by the idea that Christianity has a single root from which everything springs: God comes down to us and raises us from death to life—to divine friendship—by His resurrection from the dead through His own power. God wants all people to be saved and Christ died for everyone. However, we know that only some respond to grace and come to that salvation and others do not. This is the mystery of divine election and predestination: out of the abundance of His mercy, God gives everyone the necessary graces to be saved. Nonetheless, due to the sins of men, His justice leads Him to only give efficacious grace and final perseverance to some. Father Domingo Báñez O.P. articulated this well.

Why do some receive the gift of these efficacious graces and final perseverance and others do not? We can never know—it has nothing to do with the merits of the person but only the inscrutable will of God: "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you." (John 15:16)

Our salvation and the Church—the Sacrament of Salvation is completely in God's capable hands. God is "running the show" and our participation in God's plan of salvation occurs because God moves us to freely partake by grace. We should not fear our own weakness because we have great hope that God will move us to work out our salvation despite our weaknesses.

Cardinal Désiré-Joseph Mercier once remarked to his seminarians that we should be certain that God will work out our salvation. He says this, not because we can know whether we are in a state of grace or one of the elect, but because Christian hope is such that any doubt as to whether God will bring about our salvation is supremely rash and disrespectful to God. Indeed, Christian hope is salvation already being accomplished.
