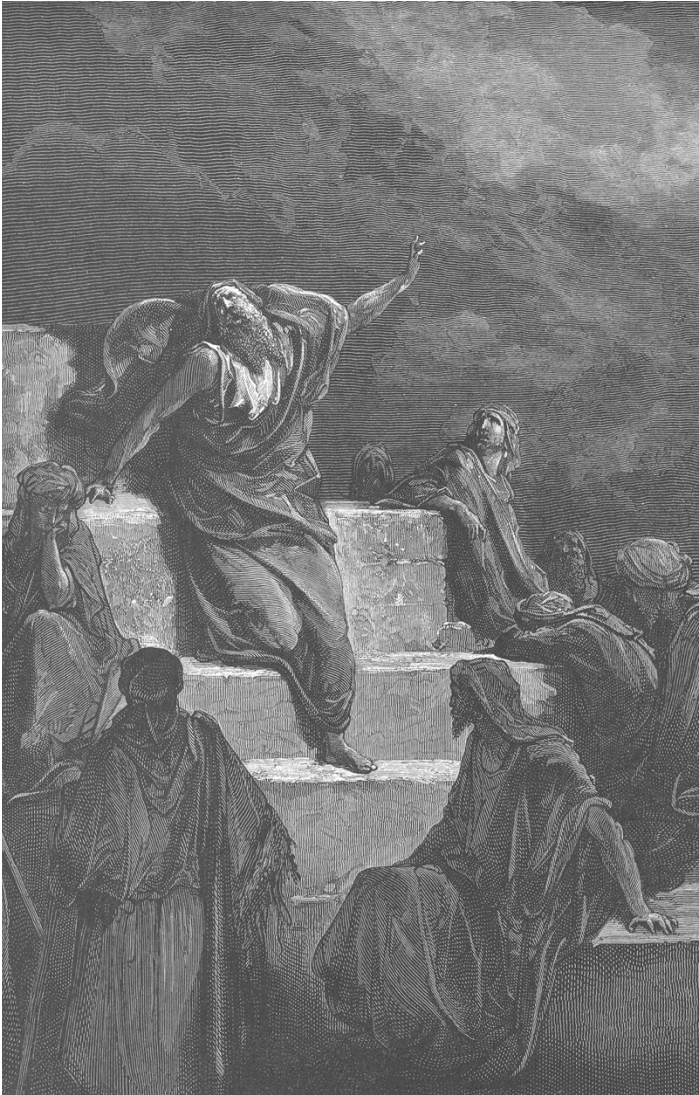

This Sunday's Gospel reading continues the theme of the previous Sunday. Last Sunday, the sudden return of the Master was an image of the Lord's unexpected return. This Sunday, Jesus speaks of the purpose of his coming. Jesus' pronouncements are perhaps quite confusing and contradictory. His mission is celebrated by the angels on Christmas Day: "Peace on earth to men of goodwill," (Lk 2:14), and introduced at the beginning of his ministry as the "Gospel of the poor" (Lk 2:14; 4:18; 7:22), but now he declares what seems to be the opposite: fire, division, and opposition.

There is no contradiction or inconsistency in the mission of Jesus. He is still the bearer of peace, the bearer of good news. First, he openly declares that his mission is to "set the earth on fire," which could refer to God's judgment. As in Luke 3:9, fire consumes unfruitful vine branches. Fire was spoken of in the Old Testament as a means of purification, and judgment. Next, Jesus regards his ministry as a "baptism", and this

baptism he himself will undergo. It can be understood that Jesus is referring to the sufferings that he is experiencing, and will have to go through to completion. This is not fate, but God's will and Jesus is willing to accept it. We can also associate this baptism with the baptism introduced by John the Baptist: Jesus himself will baptize not with water, but with the Holy Spirit and fire (cf. Lk 3:16). Through this baptism he will judge all nations.

In the end, Jesus' mission will bring about division and opposition, even division within the family. Peace was certainly the aim of Jesus' mission as the evangelist Luke announced in his Gospel. Jesus' ministry will be completed at the end of time when there will be purifications and judgments before full peace reigns. It is Jesus himself who becomes the point of division between people, between those who choose to follow him and those who reject him. Accepting the teachings of Jesus requires radical detachment from the world and setting our hearts on fire for the love of God and neighbor through daily prayer and service. This is the challenge for us this week: strengthen our relationship with Jesus by allowing Him to set our hearts on fire with love!
