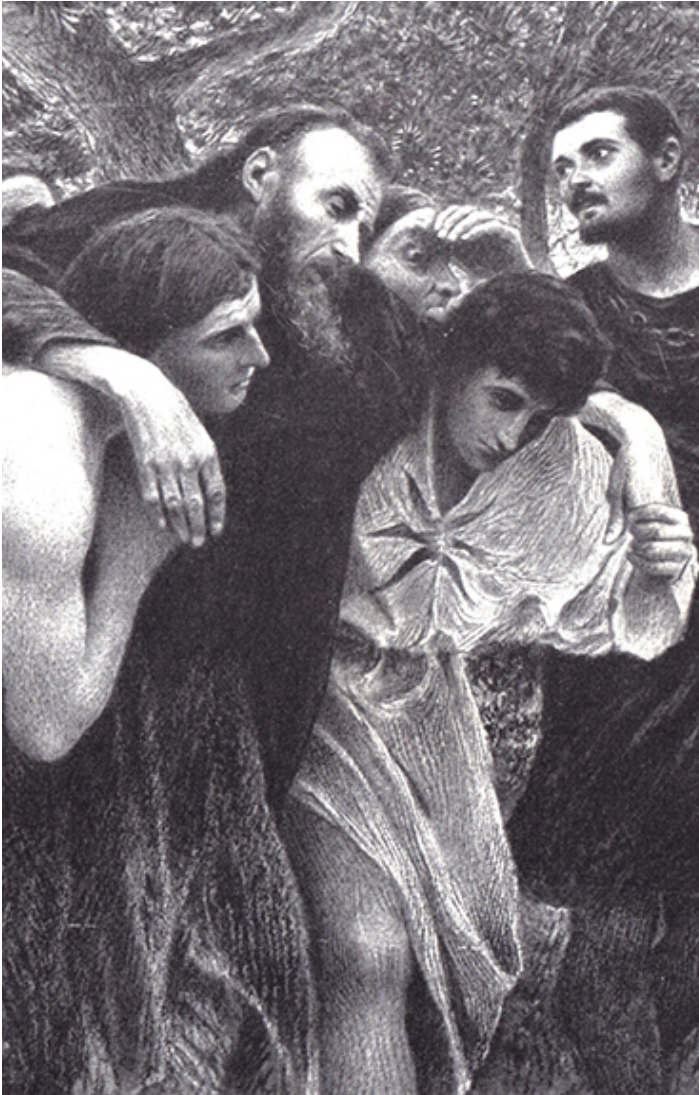

Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

It has been said that Holy Rosary Catholic Church is a jewel box in the heart of Portland. I think that this was meant figuratively as well as literally. After all, there are many beautiful churches in the greater Portland area. And yet people have been flocking to us Dominicans (sometimes driving over an hour) for over a hundred years. There's no denying that our church is beautiful and keeping it that way is a literally a labor of love. Many of you remember Fr. Anthony Patalano from years past. He was especially attentive to the interior beauty of the church, making both dramatic and subtle changes to enhance our worship. That said, there are also many invisible yet critical components to our church that require equal if not more attention.

Forty years ago, we installed an HVAC system for the main building. Unfortunately, it was underpowered and has already reached the end of its life. Similar systems have normal lifespans of 15-20 years. We've kept it humming, but always with a risk of failure. While we can still pump out cool air for our warm summer days, it has never really had the ability keep up. Furthermore, last spring the heating component failed and had to be shut off completely. This has necessitated the revamping of the entire HVAC system since we don't want to enter the cold winter months without heat. Fixing the system is no longer an option.

The logistics of replacing the HVAC are not without challenges. Beginning on September 19th and lasting for approximately seven (7) weeks, we will have to make the following changes:

1. Monday through Friday, the following will move to Siena Hall (north partition):

- 11 AM Confessions
(Siena Hall will open at 10:30 AM)
- 12 PM Mass
- 12:30-2:30 PM Adoration
(Siena Hall will close at 2:30 PM)

2. Monday through Friday, 6 AM and 7 AM Masses and any evening liturgies will remain in the church.

3. Saturday and Sunday Masses will remain in the church.

4. Sunday coffee and doughnuts will remain in Siena Hall (south partition+classroom).

This is an inconvenience, but we've done this before after the fire in the 1990s. Furthermore, our liturgical schedule will not be impacted. We ask for your patience during this period as we continue to maintain and improve our jewel box for the next hundred years.

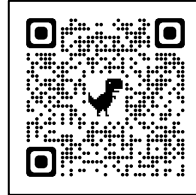
