## Dear Parishioners:

One of the best aspects of serving as a priest here at Holy Rosary is the ability to hear confessions for so many people every week. It is the most intimate of sacraments. For a single moment it is where a person can concretely experience the mercy of God and where a priest can fulfill his vocation to be a true dispenser of that same mercy.

Yet, as human persons we can sometimes experience impediments to that mercy. Sometimes we confess a sin and still years later we can feel bound down by its weight. This can be so strong that it can cause us to doubt the efficacy of the Sacrament of Penance and so too God's mercy. What is to be done?

Something that we are not often taught (or we just forget or do not understand at that age) when we are preparing for our first confession is that part of the sacrament is the importance of the satisfaction that is accomplished by the penance that we perform after we have received sacramental absolution. It is the responsibility of the priest to give a suitable penance that satisfies justice so we can "work off" the temporal punishment due to us because of the sins we have committed. However, priests are not infallible so we do not always get the proportions right. When this happens, our conscience can hold on to those past sins even though we have been truly forgiven. Over time this wears away at us because our conscience is not satisfied.

One way to solve this problem is by voluntarily taking on a simple penance, like fasting one day a week, in reparation for that past sin. After some time, your conscience will release you from the guilt because justice will have finally been satisfied. This is something that we can do for as many past, confessed sins as is needed so that we can gain the peace and sanctity that Christ desires for us all to possess.

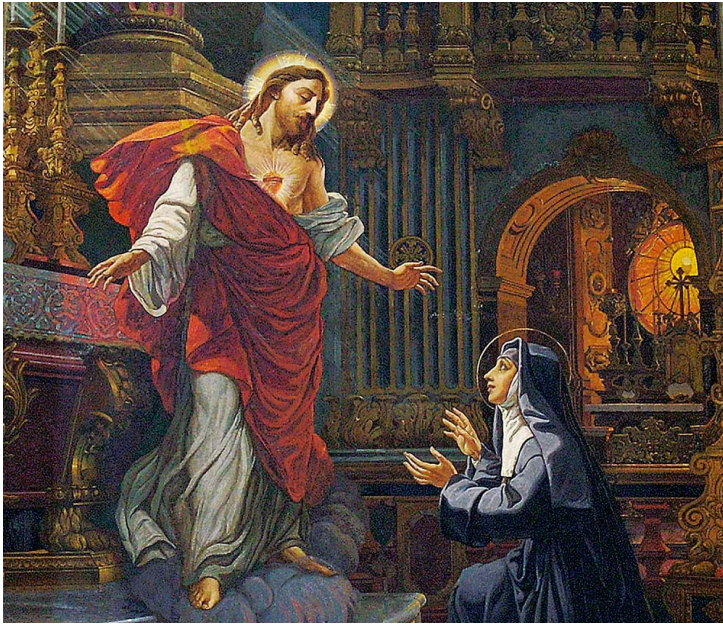
