Dear Parishioners:



Wait! Christmas is not over! Like Easter, Christmas is an Octave (8 days) and goes from Christmas Day to New Year's Day. It is unlike the Easter Octave in that during the Christmas Octave we also simultaneously celebrate several Feast Days. Normally the 26th is St. Stephen's Day, the Church's first martyr, but this year since he falls on Sunday, we'll celebrate The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph instead. Then we celebrate the Evangelist, St. John, followed by the Feast of the Holy Innocents. On the first of January we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. So indeed, it's a busy week plus one. Naturally, Epiphany, the manifestation of Christ will come on January 2nd followed by the Baptism of the Lord on January 9th. Under the new calendar, it would be this day that concludes the Christmas season. So, don't take your decorations down just yet.

This might contrast with our secular version of the Christmas season which usually ends on Christmas Day. Then, we might be traveling; we might go on outings—perhaps to the beaches or to the mountains. Or, we might have family and friends over since school is still out and we might have taken some extra days off. Whatever we do, we shouldn't lose sight of the Incarnation of Christ in our world. God chose to send Jesus not as a powerful ruler, but as an infant child. This is a conundrum to many, and an insult to others. Yet, it goes to show how much God loves us—to be weakened, emptied of all his glory, and to dwell among us.

As we head towards the end of the year, let us take note that beyond our hardships, beyond our disagreements (political or otherwise), Jesus is what motivates us and gives us courage, even amongst our greatest fears. It is difficult to look at the baby Jesus lying in a manger and not smile.
