*Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,*

The holiness of the Church follows from the sacramental character marking baptized souls through the sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and Holy Orders, along with the graces communicated by all the sacraments. In this way, the baptized participate in the life of Christ and form one body in faith, hope, and love—a communion in Christ that builds up the mystical body with living stones. The visible Church follows from and manifests this invisible communion which itself leads to visible expressions. Thus, the visible and invisible Church are not two realities, but one complex reality formed out of a divine and human element (*Lumen Gentium*, 8)

Nonetheless, just as a dead limb is visibly part of the body in a certain sense, but ultimately not because it is dead—so too there are those visibly part of the Church, and even visible abuses of public offices, that depart from communion in Christ and are therefore dead.

The analogy of a living/dead body helps us understand how we can reasonably affirm one *Holy* Catholic and Apostolic Church while admitting the great wickedness committed by many of her members, even in the abuse of their public offices.

Insofar as the Church is Christ's mystical body, it can never be corrupted and will always be holy. However, due to the mystery of iniquity, both people and actions visibly appear as part of the Church which depart from that inner communion provided by the Holy Spirit that animates the Church into a living body.

Within the Church throughout history, we see weeds among wheat that are destined to be consumed in the furnace. However, we also find great saints, acts of charity, and the holiness of ordinary people not recognized by the Church, but known to both God and anyone who meets them. We know there will be more weeds, but we also know that Christ will produce more saints by incorporating them more fully into His mystical body, that communion of grace enlivening the Church.

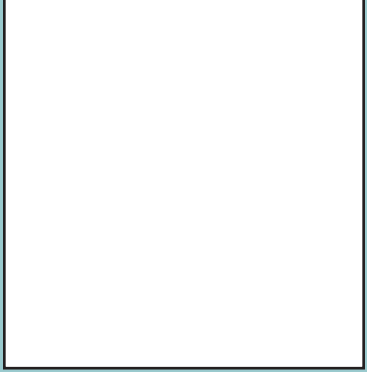
