Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

Two weeks ago, on January 28th, we celebrated the feast of St. Thomas Aquinas, a date that was chosen because of its great devotional importance for our saint after his death.

Summoned by the Pope to assist at the Second Council of Lyon, Thomas was on his way to France when he became gravely ill. He stopped at a Cistercian monastery of Fossanova, not wanting to die away from a religious community. Getting steadily worse, he died about a month later.

Already regarded as a saint, there was little delay in turning to him for intercession. The subprior of the monastery, who had suffered for months from a severe eye infection, was perhaps the first to invoke him. Just after Thomas died, when the monks were preparing his body for burial, the subprior placed his face up against Thomas's face, asking for a healing. Immediately he was cured. It was the beginning of a great surge in popular devotion to Thomas, miracles, and pilgrimages to Fossanova, where his relics remained for the next 95 years. During this time Thomas's body was also found to be incorrupt, emitting a wonderful fragrance throughout the monastery on a number of occasions when the tomb was opened.

The Dominicans for decades had been trying to obtain the relics of our great saint, and finally in 1368 they were handed over to the Order. On January 28th of the following year, St. Thomas's bones (the monks had boiled off the flesh in order to hide the relics away in a smaller reliquary!), were solemnly placed in the Church of Les Jacobins in Toulouse, France, where his relics can be seen today.

So, the 28th of January, at first celebrated as a feast of the translations of his relics (his main feast was the day of his death, March 7th), now has been made his main feast day on the new liturgical calendar.

This year we Dominicans celebrate the 700th anniversary of his canonization, which was on July 18, 1323. As a special way of honoring St. Thomas, Pope Francis has granted a plenary indulgence throughout this year's celebration, as well as next year when we honor the anniversary of his death, in 1274. Whenever one visits a Dominican church or shrine, including our own parish, and spends a short time in prayer, concluding with an Our Father, Apostle's Creed, and invocation of Our Lady and St. Thomas, a plenary indulgence will be granted. Implied also are the usual requirements of recent confession, Holy Communion, and sincerely turning against all our sins, even our habits of venial sin that hinder us from holiness.

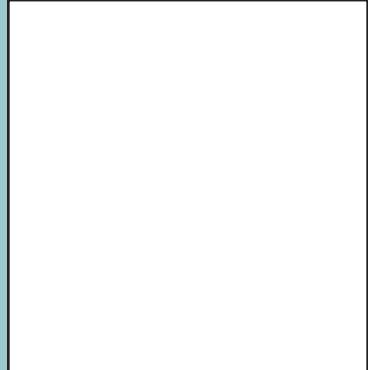
