Dear Parishioners:

It is snowing! Hopefully it will subside and disappear by Sunday. In the meantime, stay safe and off the roads. It's icy. This will be the last Sunday in Ordinary Time before going into the Lenten Season. Hence, by the time I communicate with you next, Ash Wednesday will have already passed and we'll be into the full swing of Lent. Most of us know that we must fast* and abstain** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, as well as abstain on each Friday in between. Remember, the requirements of the Church oblige us to do these things, but they're "easy enough" so that even the weak can handle them. As individual Christians we can do so much more. Health and age reasons aside, most of us here at the parish, indeed in the entire country, certainly have the capability to be more aggressive in doing acts of penance and acts of charity to God and neighbor. In this time of uncertainty, I think it is an excellent time to recognize that the God, the author of life, is really in control, and that our Lenten practices help us focus on this reality. This year, why not focus on adding things? We can certainly add more prayer times, more acts of charity to our neighbor, more spiritual reading. The list is endless.

Because of the Government's response to the pandemic, we will obviously have to change a few things in our normal schedule. Thus, we will continue to have Stations of the Cross on Fridays of Lent both at 11:00a and 7:00p. There will be confessions during these times. Unfortunately, we cannot have Lenten Soup Suppers that typically follow the 7:00p Stations. Also, during Lent because of time conflicts, there will be no 1st Friday devotions to the Sacred Heart. We do still offer three alternative Masses on those days.

On Ash Wednesday we will have four Masses with imposition of ashes: 6:00a (Dominican Rite), 7:00a, noon, and 7:00p (sung Solemn High Dominican Rite). Confessions will begin at 10:00a and end at the noon Mass. There will be adoration of the Blessed Sacrament per our normal schedule.

I pray for a good, healthy, and productive Lent for you all and I hope to see you onsite.

* Fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday involves the eating of a single meal with no snacking. For those where a single meal would be an excessive burden, two small meals may be added, but the combined quantity should not exceed that of a full meal. Children up until 13 and Adults older than 59 are exempt for health reasons.

** Abstaining on Ash Wednesdays and Fridays of Lent (including Good Friday), involves the refraining from the eating of meat on those days. In general, we would exclude land animals (e.g., chicken, pork, and beef). But it could include seafood (e.g., fish and shellfish). Nobody is exempt from abstinence.
