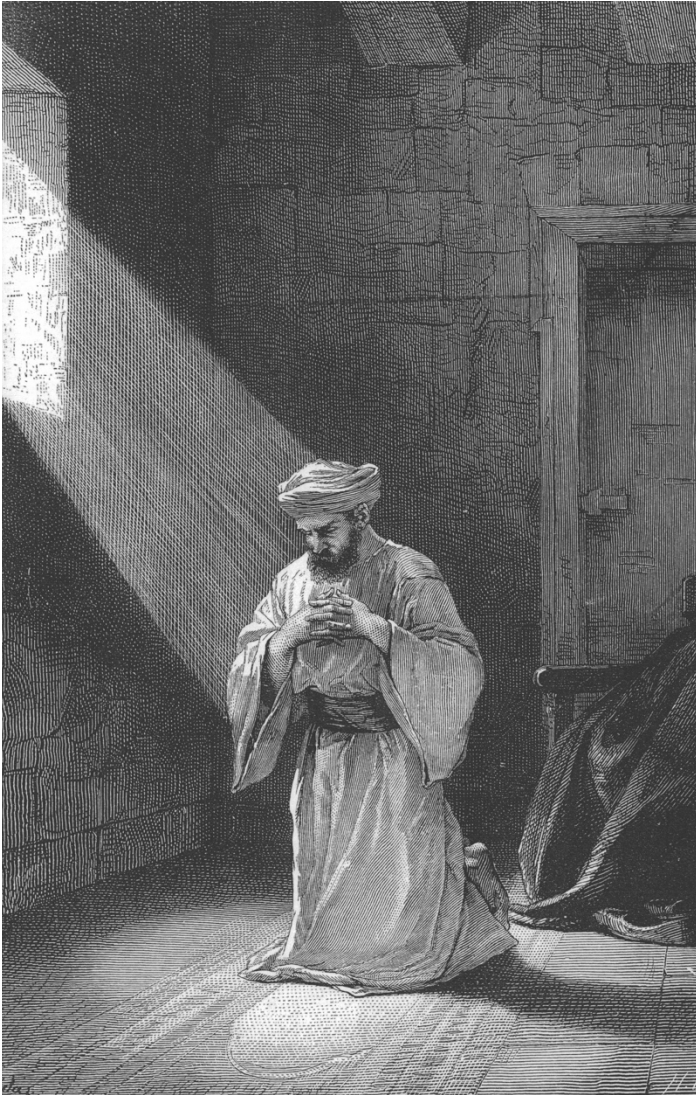

Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

Ash Wednesday is one of the two days each year we Catholics are obliged to fast and abstain from meat. Fasting means a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but they are not to equal that of a full meal. The norms of fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. The Church requires all adult Catholics ages 14 and onwards to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent. The other day of fasting and abstinence is Good Friday, in which we remember the death of our Lord Jesus on the cross. Also, please note that on Ash Wednesday, we will have many people coming to Mass to receive ashes. Plan to attend early if you are hoping to find a seat and parking.

Since Lent begins on February 22nd with Ash Wednesday this year, it is a good time to prepare ourselves and to reflect on how we can get rid of vices and grow in virtue during these forty days of Lent. To help with that preparation, I encourage each of us to do a deep examination of conscience and determine the areas of our life that need to change. Many of us Catholics have a pious tradition of giving up something during Lent. Some of us may, for instance, give up chocolate, social media, coffee, or smoking. Lent is also a time we can take up a Lenten practice, such as praying the Rosary daily, or committing to attending Mass daily. I challenge everyone to consider doing both: give up something and also take up a Lenten practice in place of that. For example, if you give up the time you would spend on social media, then you can use that time to pray or spend with your family. If you don't use the money to buy that coffee, then you can use that money to give to the poor. Also, consider what you are passionate about doing, and what you dread doing. Perhaps coupling those two things together may make it more feasible during Lent.

For Lent, The Knights of Columbus at Holy Rosary have once again offered to prepare a soup supper following the 7 pm Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings. Please plan to join us. There are few things that build a community of faith more than sharing a meal after prayer and worship. The Dominican priests have also committed to increasing the time for confessions. Like Advent, on all Sundays of Lent, the confessional will be open a half hour before all Masses. On Tuesdays and Fridays of Lent, we will have two priests sitting in the confessional at 11 am. This will mean that there will be no 11 am Stations of the Cross on Fridays of Lent.

Finally, effective immediately, we have ended the Wednesday evening adoration and confessions. Our friars would like each Wednesday evening to be our community time together. With all the various ministries that happen during the week, and weekends, we friars would like to strengthen our communal life of prayer, study, and recreation. If you
