## Dear Parishioners:

I am excited to say that people are returning to Mass at Holy Rosary! The Archbishop has done an admirable job at communicating with the State in order to allow us the freedoms that we need to practice our Faith. It's unfortunate that we often get lumped in with other Christian communities, where close contact is not only common it is even encouraged. We have implemented procedures in our liturgies that reduce and limit the possibility of exposure and spread in accordance with Archdiocesan guidelines. Archbishop Sample also advised me in a recent meeting that there have been no cases of any Catholic church being the source of an outbreak. This is in surprising contrast with some retailers and other public institutions. So, this is very good news.

That said, we cannot be complacent. We all still need to observe these procedures primarily out of obedience and charity. While some of us might not be fearful, our neighbor might not feel the same way. Plus, we don't want to risk having our freedom to worship taken away should a careless act of defiance turn into a maelstrom. If you feel that our procedures are not sufficient, or if you find yourself or a family member in vulnerable class, then please remember that the Archbishop's decree of suspending the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains in effect. And, if you or a family member have any cold or flu symptoms, out of safety and charity, you should remain at home and take appropriate measures.

But, back to the better news of people returning to Mass. Our good fortune poses us with an interesting, but good, problem. We priests depend on our parish family members to help us at Mass. It's one of the reasons that technically we should not say that we're "attending" Mass. This sounds like a passive, spectator posture and it is this attitude that contributed to the language of "active participation" so often misinterpreted from the Vatican II documents. The actual English word is "assist." In fact, everyone assists at Mass (and any other liturgical celebration). It's just that some of our people have different and distinct roles. We participate with our mere presence, even if it is seemingly silent and without distinct movement.

Right now, we have an immediate need for more ushers, altar servers, readers, and even sacristans. This is a need not just on Sundays and Holy Days, but also throughout the week. Although it might be convenient to pin the vacancies on the pandemic, even prior to Covid we struggled at filling some of these slots. Please contact the office at (503) 235-3163 to see which positions might suit you best and how you might train for these positions. Jesus says that the harvest is great but the laborers are few. This is so true! There is no question that we have sufficient people coming to Mass. If we can make it here, we can take on these roles. Most importantly, I invite our altar boys to return to most of our Masses. This is an important step in their formation, regardless of their vocation.

Lastly, Lent is nearly upon us even as the Christmas Season closed (definitively) on the Feast of the Presentation (Purification), February 2nd. Ash Wednesday is the 17th of
