Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

Petitionary prayer serves the spiritual life by reminding us that we depend on God for absolutely everything. All good things come from God, the Creator and Sustainer of all things. However, He has set aside some goods that only petitionary prayer can attain. So we should ask God for what we need.

However, receiving something from God that I petitioned for cannot prove to us that God acted on account of our prayer. If I said “Hail Mary full of grace, help me find a parking space”, and found a good parking space, in no way could I conclude that the good parking space was due to my prayer. Likewise, if there was a storm outside and I decided to hang a rosary out on the clothing line to get God to stop it, and the storm stopped, in no way could I establish a causal connection between my pious act and the storm ceasing. Some event happening prior to another does not suffice for establishing a causal connection.

We can become superstitious and attempt to gain control over God by becoming vainly interested in what causes God uses for His bestowal of good things. We can become too concerned with what “worked” and what did not “work.”

Our Lord promises that, when we ask for what is necessary for salvation with humility and perseverance, our prayer has an infallible efficacy—we hold this by faith. On these occasions, we can know God has acted on account of our prayer. Such a conclusion does not come from post hoc, ergo propter hoc reasoning. In other instances though, we merely presume God answered our prayer and thank him anyways. At the very least, we should remember that, regardless of the instrumental efficacy of a particular prayer, whatever good we receive comes from God and we owe Him thanks.
