Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

As of Wednesday we have begun our Lenten discipline, and this first Sunday of Lent the Church gives us a Gospel about Christ's temptations. In doing so, we have a clear message through the liturgy that sanctity can be gained only by those prepared to enter into a spiritual battle.

And there can be misunderstanding about this. People can wonder, 'Why am I having to undergo temptations in life when I stay close to Christ, and keep up my prayer life, and partake regularly of the sacraments. Should not all these sources of grace, as it were, lift me out of the war zone, and the assaults of the demons?'

St. Thomas says that one of the reasons why it was fitting for Jesus to undergo temptation was to help us be realistic about the Christian life. Thomas explains that we should pay attention to the fact that Christ underwent temptation after His baptism, not before. And this because, as Hilary says: "The temptations of the devil assail those principally who are sanctified, for he desires, above all, to overcome the holy" (III,41,1).

The Angelic Doctor not meaning that the baptism of John brought about sanctification for Our Lord, who was Himself the source of all holiness. But that the sequence of events was planned by Christ very intentionally to teach us about our sanctification through baptism. Specifically, that we should get real about what this new holiness through baptism does for us with respect to spiritual battles in life. It makes us a target. The devil ...desires, above all, to overcome the holy. The more we advance in the spiritual life, the more we can expect to have opposition and attacks from our spiritual enemies: the world, the flesh, and the devil.

So, casting aside any misconceptions about how holiness frees us from temptation, what are we to do against them? How do we defend ourselves? What will make us victorious? Our Lord, in speaking to St. Faustina, gives us five points. He says:

First, do not fight against a temptation by yourself, but disclose it to the confessor at once, and then the temptation will lose all its force.

Second, during these ordeals do not lose your peace; live in my presence; ask my Mother and the saints for help.

Third, have the certitude that I am looking at you and supporting you.

Fourth, do not fear either struggles of the soul or any temptations, because I am supporting you; if only you are willing to fight, know that the victory is always on your side. Fifth, know that by fighting bravely you give me great glory and amass merits for yourself. Temptation gives you a chance to show me your fidelity (Diary 1560).
