Dear Parishioners:

If you receive our email messages, you likely read the below on Wednesday afternoon. Normally, the message is intended for the bulletin for the upcoming Sunday. The reason for this is that we get our bulletins printed by an outside firm. Doing so cuts our costs since this company bears all the burdens of paper, ink, and printing. The requirement on our side is to promote the advertisers on the back page.

Speaking of which, the advertisers do a great service to our parishioners. Not only do they fund the printing of our bulletins (which is costly) but many of the businesses that advertise are owned and operated by our own parishioners! It's easy to give this page a miss or to ignore it. But I encourage you to look at them carefully. Often they're goods and services that we need but we don't know where to look. Or, perhaps you own your own business and would like to advertise to a more focused group. If so, give us a call (503) 235-3163, or visit during office hours and we'll make the necessary arrangements.

Because we have to have the bulletin contents ready ahead of time occasionally there are occasions where we need to announce and/or remind our parishioners of upcoming events that would be too late if received on Sunday. This week is one such week. Therefore, we have a number of activities in the parish that I encourage you all to attend:

1. On Saturday, January 29 at 11a, we will be having a Holy Hour in the Church sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. We will be joining all the parishes in the State of Oregon for guidance of the Holy Spirit in the Synodal process now under way. And, we also pray for deeper understanding of the dignity and sacredness of human life from conception to natural death.

2. On Sunday, January 30 after the morning Masses (7a, 9a, and 11a), the Knights of Columbus will be providing a classic breakfast in honor of the anniversary of the consecration of Holy Rosary Church. Who can resist a free meal where we can fraternize with fellow parishioners? It's a great opportunity to rebuild our parish community and to meet many of the new families that have recently joined.

3. In Siena Hall at the breakfast (in item 2 above), the adoration coordination team will have a table present to promote and sign up for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in our parish. As most of us know we have weekday adoration after the noon Mass until 2:30p, Wednesday evening adoration and Benediction at 7:00p, and special adorations & confessions for special groups sprinkled throughout the month. While this is all good news, it's still a far cry from pre-pandemic times where we had 7 hours of adoration every weekday. It's probably too early to say whether or not we can restore ourselves that schedule. But we won't know unless we have volunteers to do so. At a minimum, in keeping with the sacredness of the sacrament, each hour requires two adorers. In the meanwhile, we're looking for adorers simply to fill out our current schedule.

HOLY ROSARY'S ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

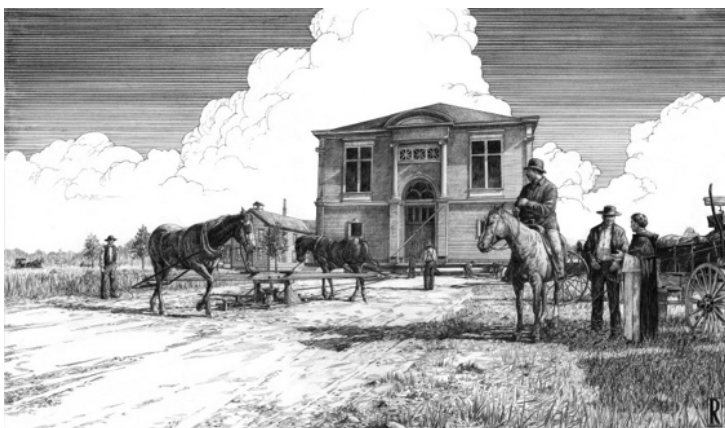

Join us for confession at 7 PM and a Dominican Rite Low Mass with Devotion to the Sacred Heart at 7:30 PM!

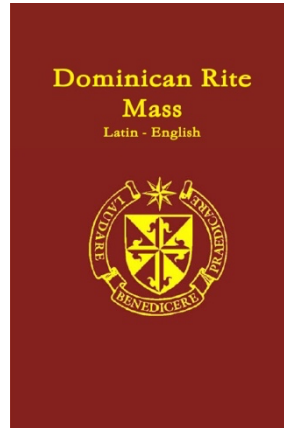
