Dear Parishioners:

We have exited the season of anticipation and entered the season of praise and thanksgiving. Now is that time as Christians to work diligently on giving ourselves over to the great virtue of patience.

Why patience? Classically, the virtue of patience is known as the safeguard of charity. So, if we are to live a life of kindness and concrete acts of charitable goodness then it is essential that we possess the virtue of patience. Patience is an assault on our pride. It is because of pride that we become short with people. We impose our expectations on others. We want things done our way in our time, according to our preferences.

However, there is nothing to suggest that we are the arbiter of these things. Rather, we tend to presume that we are, or that others have agreed to these presumptions. Then when people don't meet those expectations we lose our patience and become angry. If we lash out in our anger we can easily act in a way that is inconsistent with virtue. So, patience helps us cope with this process.

So, pray for patience, actively work on this virtue so that you might find yourself in a much kinder and tolerant disposition whereby you might possess charity more readily and therefore be empowered by His grace to be a true gift to others, just as our Lord is a gift to us.
