Dear Parishioners:

The whole world has been shaken in fear by the recent pandemic and current socio-political turmoil. Now more than ever we need to come together as God's Church to proclaim the light and hope of Jesus' saving Gospel. In the light of Archbishop Sample's lifting of the Mass dispensation this month,* the words of St. Pope John Paul II's homily which opened his pontificate come to mind "Do not be afraid. Open wide the doors for Christ." The love of Christ casts out all fear. Each and every one of us, individually and as a parish, needs to open wide the doors of our hearts to let Jesus Our Lord and Savior in. We are invited to return to the fount of life through the Sacraments with a renewed fervor. We are so blessed to have access to them and to participate in the beautiful and reverent prayer of the Mass at Holy Rosary. But, as Pope Francis has encouraged us time and time again, we are also called to open the doors of the Church, and our parish community, to let Jesus out so that the world, which is in such desperate need of salvation, may experience the true healing and peace that is found in God alone.

Our parish exists for the salvation of souls. Through different events these next few weeks our parish is proposing a refreshed commitment to sharing the joy of the Gospel. We all know someone who is searching for meaning and purpose. Perhaps it is a family member, co-worker, or friend. Maybe they are a fallen away Catholic or just curious. Why not invite them to the Come and See Sunday or the Stations of the Cross? What do you have to lose? We believe that Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. St. Paul exhorts us that it is "more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35). We need to take ownership of our faith and our parish, beginning with these outreach events. "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." Like St Paul, we must say, "woe to me if I don't preach the Gospel" (1 Cor. 9:17).

CANTORES IN ECCLESIA POSTPONES 2021 WILLIAM BYRD FESTIVAL

It is with sadness and regret that I announce the postponement of the 2021 William Byrd Festival. While public activities are

slowly re-emerging after restrictions implemented in response to the COVID-19 pandemic are lifted, continued restrictions to international travel from the United Kingdom will not be relaxed before the end of July at the earliest. As Festival Director Mr. Mark Williams works and resides in the United Kingdom, this travel restriction prevents us from finalizing plans for the William Byrd Festival this year. We anticipate reestablishing the annual William Byrd Festival in the summer of 2022, now scheduled for August 5-21, 2022. We eagerly look forward to seeing you then.

Artistic Director Mark Williams writes from Oxford:

The experience of the last 16 months may have given us a greater awareness and understanding of some of the privations encountered by William Byrd and his fellow Catholics during the years of the English Reformation. After a period in which so much of what we love has been taken from us, I had hoped that this year’s William Byrd Festival might represent the beginning of a return to those things we cherish – music-making and fellowship. But that was not to be, and I am extremely sorry that I cannot travel to the United States at this time. The musicians, lecturers, clergy, supporters and friends associated with the Byrd Festival have become friends, and to be separated from friends for such a long time is challenging. Byrd’s response to hardship and oppression was to write some of the most beautiful music we know, and I hope that we might also respond creatively and strengthened by faith when the time comes for us to be together once more. Portland and *Cantores in Ecclesia* remain in my thoughts and prayers, and I look forward to seeing you very soon.
