Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

July is the month of the Precious Blood. The feast of the Most Precious Blood was instituted in 1849 by Pope Pius IX. The great doctor of the church St. Ambrose, who was the archbishop of Milan and the teacher who converted and baptized St. Augustine of Hippo in the 4th century, wrote this about the Precious Blood: "As Eve was formed from the sleeping Adam's side, so the Church was born from the pierced heart of Christ hanging dead on the Cross." Blood flowed from our Savior's head, hands, and feet. But especially from His side, blood and water flowed which gave birth to the Church.

The blood of our Savior is seen most visibly in his sacrificial death on the cross, which is our Lord's act of redemption and salvation for us. Most of us who have seen the movie "The Passion of the Christ" by Mel Gibson know how much Jesus shed his blood on the cross for us. His death on the cross is the sacrifice for the forgiveness of our sins. The shedding of his blood is the fundamental part of this sacrifice, representing the pouring out of his life for the salvation of humanity. Through his blood, our Lord's sacrifice also brings about the reconciliation between God and humanity. We might also recall that Luke, the Evangelist and a physician, recorded that while praying in the garden, Jesus' sweat was like drops of blood: "And being in agony, He prayed more earnestly. Then His sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground" (Luke 22:44).

In this month of devotion to the Precious Blood, let us set aside time in Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. We have extended Adoration time at Holy Rosary from 12:30 pm until 4:30 pm Monday thru Friday. During the celebration of the Mass, let us also be aware that not only does bread become the Body of Christ, but the wine is consecrated and transformed into the Blood of Christ. We must underscore the importance of the Precious Blood in our sacramental life as Catholics.

Devotion to the Precious Blood should also extend to our private prayers, meditations, and acts of piety as we reflect on Christ's sacrificial love and seek to deepen our understanding of its profound significance in our spiritual journey. Let us pray: O God, who by the Precious Blood of your Only Begotten Son have redeemed the whole world, preserve in us the work of your mercy so that, ever honoring the mystery of our salvation, we may merit to obtain its fruits. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

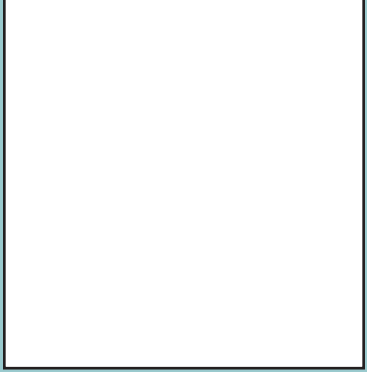
