Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

Our sharing in the death and resurrection of Christ through baptism requires us Christians to put to death anything in our old self that is contrary to our new life in Christ.

However, our death in Christ is not a complete destruction of ourselves, as if our entire selves were corrupted by original sin, such that we need to obliterate ourselves to experience the new life that Christ provides. If we pay attention to the structure our reading from Saint Paul's letter to the Colossians, we will begin to appreciate exactly what Saint Paul means by "Put to death . . ."

Saint Paul tells us that we have died with Christ and that we must put to death the parts of ourselves that are earthly, those parts of us—not the whole person—that still belong to the old earthly self corrupted by sin and the power of the devil. The old earthly self contrasts with the new self of the new heaven and earth being brought about through Christ.

What are the parts of ourselves that we must put to death? Saint Paul lists some: immorality, impurity, immoderate passion, evil desires, and the idolization of money. However, in saying that we must put to death parts of ourselves, Saint Paul implicitly presupposes that the whole person is fundamentally good, since we are created in the image and likeness of God. We possess a great dignity which is proper to our nature as creatures with reason, who, because of our rational nature, have an inherent capacity to have a relationship with God. We should not put to death what is good in us!

Our new life in Christ is the new self, which Jesus continually renews with the graces He eternally merits, standing in the presence of the Father and offering Himself, showing the Father the sacred wounds of His passion.

The new self is the human person renewed by Christ, with its dignity renewed and elevated by grace—a renewal that more and more conforms us to God as His image, a conformity which provides us a foretaste of the vision of God even in this life through the gift of faith.
