

Dear Parishioners:



"What are those things on the altar?" This is a question I've been asked over the last couple of years and never have had the opportunity to answer in a wider forum. Since our major liturgical season has come to an end (whew) and COVID restrictions have been much relaxed, I have more opportunities to focus on positive aspects of our Faith. The simple answer to the question is that they are reliquaries.

They hold relics from some of our treasured Saints. We have four reliquaries not because it's a required number but because it looks balanced on the altar.

A relic is not a talisman nor is it anything magical. Rather they are signs that point to the people who had strong faith or have had a significant role or inspiration to the faithful. On the other hand, there have been instances where the Holy Spirit has worked through relics to bring particular graces to individuals and/or situations. But we must be continually mindful that these relics must ultimately lead us to Christ. They do not draw attention to themselves and this misunderstanding has often given non-Catholics an opportunity to criticize them as superstitious tokens.

Rather than go into the theology of relics, it's best to think of them as reminders of those who have gone before us. Do we not treasure the pocket watch of our grandfathers, or the rosary of our grandmothers? Do we not keep photographs of our children and grandchildren? These acts are not that far off the mark. Glancing at or touching these items often reorients our thoughts and prayers. Again, for relics they lead us to Christ.

As for the relics on our altar, this is the list:

- 1. St. Blaise (1st class)
- 2. St. Vincent de Paul (1st class)
- 3. St. Juan Macías, OP (1st class)
- 4. St. Teresa of Jesus (1st class)
- 5. St. Rita of Cascia (2nd class)
- 6. St. Gregory (the Great) (1st class)
- 7. Bl. Imelda, OP (1st class)
- 8. St. Pius X (1st class)
- 9. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (1st class)
- 10. St. Maria Goretti (1st class)
- 11. St. Martin de Porres, OP (1st class)
- 12. Holy Martyr of Gorkum, OP (1st class)

Relics are categorized according to importance. A 1st class relic

comes from their body (e.g., blood, bone, hair). A 2nd class relic comes from something that they wore or used with frequency (e.g., tunic, habit, staff). A 3rd class relic comes for any item that a saint touched.

We also have some more significant relics that we store away for more important liturgical days. When we bring them out, they usually replace the statue of the Sacred Heart or of St. Joseph, and we adorn them with lit candles. We do have, for instance, a relic of the True Cross, the veil of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Crown of Thorns, among others. It is amazing to think that our humble Church has some of these very inspirational items. Hopefully they will help inspire us to contemplate more on our Faith, especially the Incarnation of Christ and the gratuitous love that God has for each and every human being.
