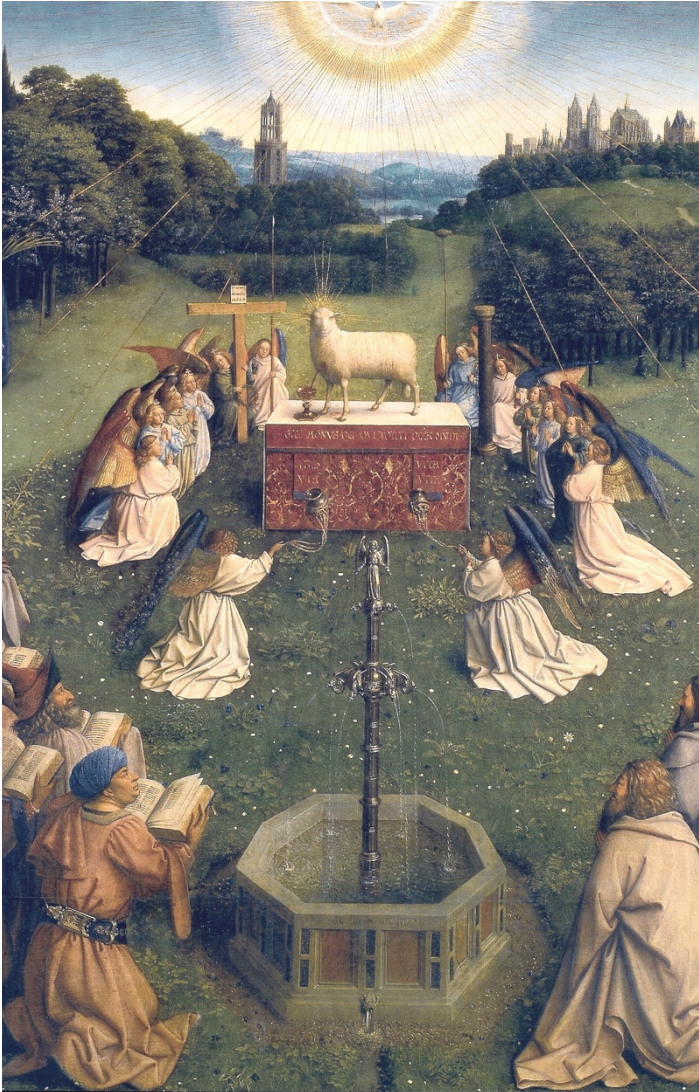

Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

The average parishioner may not necessarily know that the Dominicans are not simply cast as parish priests. In fact, St. Dominic himself formed the Order of Preachers to be complementary and often contrary to bishops and their dioceses. That Dominicans are involved in parochial ministry is, indeed, an anomaly of 19th century history which saw unprecedented growth and expansion in our country. The US bishops realized that their own priests could not possibly minister to the many immigrant communities and the new territories of an expanding nation. As such, almost all religious communities were asked to take on parishes to help and these parishes were usually the only way that these orders could establish foundations.

As much as we friars might enjoy the fruits of parochial ministry (here in Portland especially), it partially neglects the primary mission of our Order, which is the salvation of souls. Parochial ministry addresses the more common notion of nourishment of souls. The Western Dominican Province has always had non-parochial ministries to address our primary mission.

These days, the dichotomy between embracing an authentic, faithful, Catholic life and living "in the world" has created problems, not just for the salvation of souls, but also for the Church. As both a former businessman and a convert, I saw this situation firsthand; it was, actually, a bit of a stumbling block in my own conversion. While the bishops and their priests have the task of evangelizing their own flock, this does little for the vast majority of people who live in the world but have not yet meaningfully encountered or embraced our Faith. I saw this as a problem and a challenge even before I entered the Dominican Order.

Given my own background and considering these challenges, our Provincial, Fr. Christopher Fadok, has asked me to address this pressing issue and it is one that I happily and readily accept. It will certainly be full of uncertainty and sacrifices and I know that I will have to rely (uncharacteristically, out of pride) upon God's Providence. To do so, however, means that I will need to depart Portland and the Holy Rosary community. My five years here has been one of incredible grace, especially in my tasks confecting the sacraments for the people of Portland, Vancouver, and beyond. I will depart at the beginning of October this year, giving ample time for me to transition to the new pastor, Fr. Peter Do, who has been the interim director of the Rosary Center right across the street. My new home will be at St. Raymond's in Menlo Park, California, which is right in Silicon Valley. It is from there that I hope to establish strong roots with the business community.

Please pray for me as I undertake this endeavor as I continue to pray for all of you.
