Holy Rosary Dominican Laity Meeting – 7:30 AM

Dear Parishioners:

As the State continues to open up, we at Holy Rosary are doing likewise (consistent with the guidelines that come directly from our Archdiocese). Thus, coming to church you should notice at least three new things this weekend:



1. **Holy Water.** Yes, the Holy Water Fonts are back at their usual places (two at the main entrance of the church and one at the north entrance). Per normal, we will keep them filled as the water slowly empties or dries up. Reports tell us that there is low risk in using them. Nevertheless, this might still bother some people (which was probably true even before COVID). It isn't

absolutely necessary to use the water, and there's nothing magical about it. We use it because it helps us orient ourselves towards Christ. Remember, still, to make the Sign of the Cross and to genuflect as you are able.

2. **Cry Room.** The cry room has actually been open and available for a couple of weeks now. This is what I have called a soft opening. People have already been taking advantage of the space and it really does give parents more peace of mind when they come to Mass and their infants and/or toddlers are extra noisy. Keep in mind that we should never view the room as a play room or a room for entertainment for kiddies. It's better for them to enter the church, recognize that it is a sacred space, and learn how to cope with being silent and reverent. This is good formation and will serve them well as they grow. Reverence for the Eucharist at an early age will translate to reverence for the Eucharist at any age.

3. **The Communion Rail.** For the past year we have had three little crosses on the floor on each side indicating where to kneel in order to receive communion. I applaud all of our parishioners in keeping to the practice of maintaining no more than three communicants per side. I have removed these crosses and we can now fill up the altar rail as we did pre-COVID. Recall, however, that some people might feel uncomfortable with this arrangement. If you fall into this category, you can choose to receive toward the end where it will be more relaxed and you can naturally space yourselves further apart. Please note that we still come up the side aisles and return down the main aisle. This will remain in place until further notice.

I realize that change is difficult, especially with large numbers of people. So, please bear this in mind if for the next few days/weeks we're slightly confused as our minds try and combat our muscle memory.
