Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

As we approach Pentecost and the end of the Easter Season, we turn our attention to the Third Person of the Holy Trinity. When Christ ascended into heaven to take his seat at the right hand of the Father, he promised that the Father would send the Holy Spirit to teach all things. We, as members of the Holy Church through Baptism open our hearts and receive this very same Spirit, he who brings truth and love in the knowledge of Jesus Christ. These questions are all answered through our Holy Mother Church. What then can we do to further the mission of the Church? We lead by example. For in fact, the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Apostles responded to the urging of the Holy Spirit. If they had not the Church would have never gotten off the ground. We often set high standards for ourselves for Lent and Easter through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Let us not drop our guard. Let us keep pointing ourselves ever so directly at the God who loves us and wants only for us to be truly happy.
