Dear Parishioners:

The Church always wants what's best for us. The trouble is that our wants, our desires, our hopes don't necessarily coincide with what's best for us. We don't need to enumerate very many examples before we discover that this is indeed the truth. Lent is the time that we can step back and evaluate our lives in contemplation. We can discover that many of our goals are self-serving, do little for God, and do still less for our fellow neighbor. This is why the Church places penances on us during Fridays of Lent and on Ash Wednesday. It encourages us to look outside of ourselves and to do more than that if we're capable.

The best thing we can do for ourselves is get to Confession. Holy Rosary has a multitude of times available for confession. Throughout the year we have it every weekday as well as on First Sundays. During Lent we extend our times, double-up our confessions, and sometimes add new slots. Please check our schedule for the latest information.

One thing that the friars have noticed is that there has been a serious lack of decorum in the confessional. Perhaps we've forgotten the prayers and formulas; perhaps we've not been encouraged; or, perhaps we simply do not know. That said, it's customary to greet the confessor with the phrase, "Bless me Father for I have sinned..." Believe it or not, this phrase is missing from most of the confessions I hear. Likewise, there should be some complementary closing, such as, "Thank you Father." I hardly ever hear this statement. Both statements are, of course, not obligatory. But they are polite. Our society has become far too casual and we have dropped a lot of formalities. Manners, however, never go out of style.
