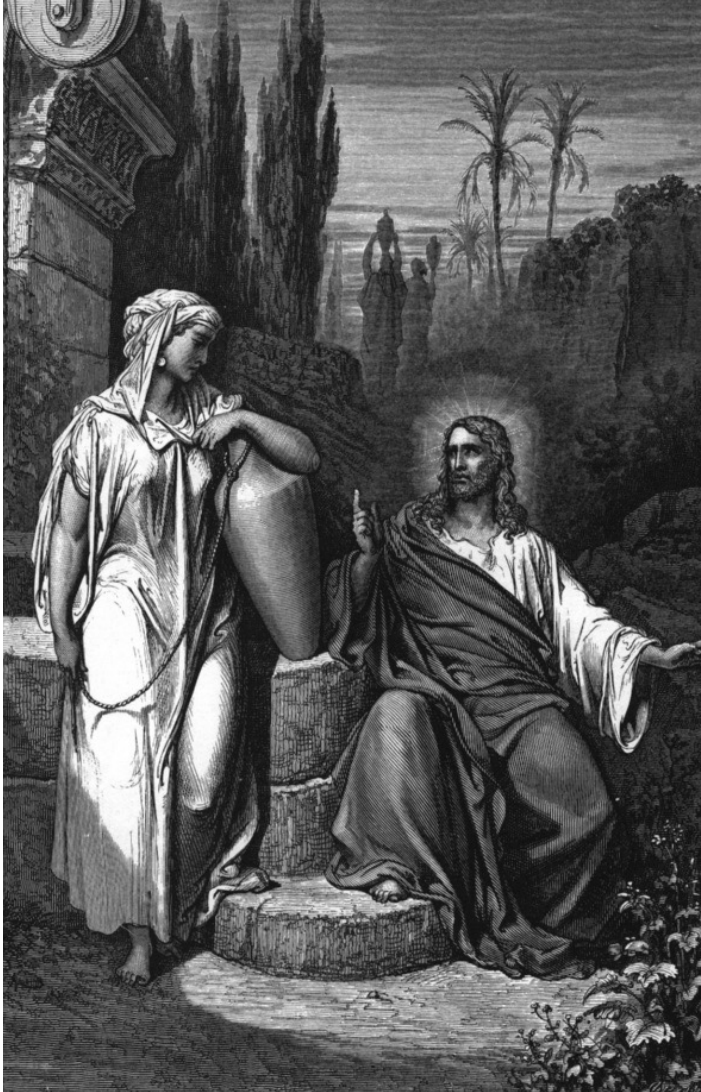

Dear Parishioners:

At the beginning of Lent, we noticed that many things changed inside the Church. Flowers are no longer placed on or near the altar. This is a reflection Jesus' entrance into the desert, which is more or less bereft of life. We saw the vestments change from green to violet. Those were the obvious visible changes. But there are more subtle ones as well.

The music is a tad more grave (minor keys), and we limit the organ to accompaniment-only, without either prelude or postlude. We suppressed the Gloria and replaced the Alleluia (which by nature are festive and incongruent with the season). The incense has changed from the more familiar frankincense to a "pontifical" variety, which actually includes wood shavings. This gives the overall smell a slightly burnt tinge. The Church desires that all of our senses be informed of what's going on, not just limiting it to our sense of sight.

Liturgically speaking, the readings and prayers are building up culminating with Christ's Passion at Holy Week. At the 9:00a Sunday Mass we use the Cycle A readings because they contribute greatly for the catechumens and candidates (the other Masses are still on Cycle C). And we will cover our statues (not the Stations) on the 5th Sunday so that we can focus more intently on the matters at hand as the liturgies unfold. It is indeed a wonderful time of year. And I encourage everyone take part in it. You might want to change the decorations in your home or your family room to be in solidarity with Christ. Kids especially respond to this. That way we have continual reminders during the week of what's coming up.
