

Dear Parishioners:

We blinked and suddenly Lent was upon us. With Lent brings a period of penance. We should recall that fasting and abstaining during the prescribed periods (Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and Fridays of Lent) are a baseline minimum. We can do far more than this. More importantly, we can do things that can specifically help us. Lenten practices are not meant to be a punishment or to damage us, but a method of helping us control our appetites and to help us meditate and recognize the sacrifice that Jesus Christ did for us on the cross. While we are not free to dispense ourselves from what the Church asks us to do (except in certain circumstances), we should be able to augment them to fit our particular predilections.

These days, we can fast from things like social media, video games, television, and other time-consuming activities replacing them with prayer and almsgiving. We can substitute healthy activities and actions in place of some of our minor addictions such as smoking, drinking, and even food. Almsgiving need not be cash or writing a check, but could instead be a gift of time either for strangers (such as volunteering), or for family (reaching out and restore some of our damaged relationships). The possibilities are endless. So even if you haven't chosen anything yet, there's still much time left in Lent.
