Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

We are not only responsible for our own anger, but also for the anger of others. Thus says Saint John Cassian in his Sixteenth Conference. He observes that some monks think they are patient when they respond to an irritated brother with bitter silence or some other mocking gesture. Such a response does not cohere with Christian charity, because these monks did not take the available steps to soothe the anger of their brother to prevent his further sin. On the contrary, they riled him up through derision and a mocking silence

As someone who has lived religious life for about ten years now, I can tell you that I have given brothers the silent treatment before. I know what Cassian is talking about; I was wrong.

Charity demands that we not injure others out of anger. However, charity also demands that we soothe the anger of another when possible or at least refrain from unnecessarily increasing it. The demand extends from our obligation to seek the spiritual good of our neighbor which immoderate anger ruins.

These demands of charity have an application far beyond the walls of the monastery. They apply to our current political controversies.

Agitating and riling people up is not consistent with Christian charity, whether at political rallies or in debates over social media. We must have solicitude for the spiritual welfare of others regardless of their political views. It is wrong to inflame their anger with our own immoderate speech regardless of whether they are Democrat or Republican. If we do so, to the extent we dispose them to a proximate danger of committing a grave sin, we commit a grave sin because we have failed to love our neighbor in a most basic way.

Of course, we need to speak the truth on important and controversial political issues, but we should speak with great moderation and caution. We should be aware that immoderate speech and polemics could induce a sinful anger in our neighbor and lead him/her to sin or even towards complete spiritual ruin.

That said, Our Lord teaches:

"Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift. (Matthew 5:23-24)

We must reconcile with our brothers and sisters before we offer spiritual sacrifices at the altar. As Saint John Cassian comments, Jesus does not specify whether those having something against us are doing so reasonably. We must also seek to reconcile with those who are angry at us unreasonably. The most obvious way is to speak with that person and seek reconciliation. However, if this is not possible, we can at least exercise friendship for that person by praying for them, making sacrifices for them, and above all

seeking their sanctification and happiness.

A good practice is to offer a day of prayer and fasting for the sanctification of that person, to call to mind their good qualities and attempt to see their virtues despite their bad qualities. If we notice apparent bad qualities, we can ask God to either correct our perception of them or replace those bad qualities with good qualities.
