Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! This central proclamation of our faith and declaration of Christ's victory of life over death, light over darkness teaches us that the Resurrection is the cause of our resurrection, offering us a share in Christ's new life. It reminds us that our journey through Lenten penance and Good Friday is directed towards the joy of Easter morning, where we encounter the Risen Lord, who has triumphed over the grave.

At the heart of our Easter celebration is the ancient tradition of the Easter Octave, eight days of continuous reflection and jubilant rejoicing, marking each day as a continuation of Easter Day itself. This sacred period invites us to dwell in the mystery of the Resurrection, a mystery so profound and lifechanging that a single day cannot contain its fullness. It reminds us that the joy of Easter is not just one day, but a whole week long, not fleeting but enduring, extending far beyond the bounds of time. The Easter octave culminates in the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday, a day emphasizing God's boundless mercy and love for each of us, calling us to trust in Jesus and extend this mercy to others. For those who attend the Latin Mass, the second Sunday of Easter is also called Quasi modo Sunday, because these words are the first words of the Entrance Antiphon: Quasi modo geniti infantes, rationabile, sine dolo lac concupiscite, ut in eo crescatis in salutem, Alleluia (like new born children you should thirst for milk, on which your spirit can grow to strength, Alleluia.) This Easter, we are especially blessed to welcome our new Catholics, Tenessa Campobassso, Talon Massman, Kyle Srnka, and Mende Coblentz, into the full communion of the Catholic Church. Their journey of faith, culminating in the Sacraments of Initiation, is a beautiful testament to the transformative power of God's grace and the welcoming embrace of our community. We congratulate them on this significant milestone in their spiritual journey and assure them of our continued support and prayers as they grow in their relationship with Christ and His Church. Easter is also a time for us to renew our baptismal promises, reaffirming our rejection of sin and our commitment to live fully in the light of Christ. This act of renewal is a powerful

reminder of our participation in the Paschal Mystery through baptism, where we died with Christ to rise to new life. As we are sprinkled with the blessed water at the beginning of Mass, let us remember our dignity as children of God and recommit ourselves to live out the Gospel with renewed zeal. May this Easter be a time of joyful gathering, heartfelt reflection, and spiritual renewal. As we bask in the light of the Risen Christ, let us extend this light to others, bearing witness to the hope and love that define our Christian calling. May the peace and joy of the Resurrection fill your homes and hearts, and may we all move forward in faith, united in our mission to be a living sign of Christ's redeeming love in the world. Wishing you and your loved ones a blessed and joyous Easter!
