

Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

The author of the Letter to the Hebrews tells us that Christ "always is able to save those who approach God through him" (Hebrews 7:25) giving testimony to the fact that Jesus Christ is the one mediator between God and men. The reason that the author gives for this is that Christ has become the Eternal High Priest.

Just as in times of old the Levitical priests atoned for themselves and for the people through intercessions and sacrifices, Christ offers an eternal atonement for the people of God through His sacrifice once and for all on the cross. The author of Hebrews tells us that Jesus can do this because He is free of the weakness and mortality of the Levitical priests and so in His own self He can offer to God an acceptable sacrifice once and for all.

Here perhaps it is helpful to remember how the act of sacrifice fits into the virtue of religion and human anthropology: In sacrifice external signs are used to lead us through the senses to offer an interior act of devotion of the heart (*devotio*). The Jews, for example, destroyed their best livestock as a sign of their submission and dependence on God. This was at the same time an offering of the sacrificer to God, who in the act of sacrifice signifies that he completely belongs to the Lord and he is led to offer *himself* with an interior oblation.

It is interesting that the Latin word "*devotio*" originally signified the act of a military general to offer himself as a sacrifice to his idols for the sake of victory in battle. Part of this signification still exists in the Christian notion of "devotion" because the devotee offers his very life to God. Likewise, Christ on the cross was both priest and victim. Christ went to the cross freely, offering Himself as a priest offers a sacrifice; He is also the one who is sacrificed, thus also being the victim.

The interior act of Christ's oblation to the Father is eternal since Christ is both man and the eternal God. It has eternal significance for us since Christ eternally bears His wounds in heaven in His resurrected body; all those graces we receive flow down from that Christ in the sight of the Father by the merit of His sacrifice and wounds.
