Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

Striving for freedom is at the heart of both our Christian lives and of our country. But freedom understood in its proper sense.

Bishop Fulton Sheen (whose beatification we still eagerly wait for) composed an inspiring set of reflections and prayers for soldiers during WWII. As we honor the deceased men and women of our nation's wars tomorrow, those who paid the ultimate sacrifice for the freedom we enjoy, it is good to remember Bishop Sheen's reflection for those in battle, and why they were there:

I am not fighting for a freedom that means the right to do whatever I please but for a freedom that means the right to do whatever I ought. Oughtness implies Law; Law implies Intelligence; and Intelligence implies God (Wartime Prayer Book).

The freedom that we seek, and for which our soldiers died, is not destructive of the human person, but one that perfects it. Freedom that wreaks havoc in our lives, that leads to misery, can hardly be a goal worth seeking.

But freedom that leads to our flourishing, the person being strengthened by virtues like wisdom, courage, patience, and generosity—this is the freedom Bishop Sheen refers to. A freedom that comes from doing what we ought, not only for ourselves as individuals, but also as members of society. The soldier is one who seeks freedom by doing what he ought, defending our homeland against those who threaten its well-being.

To be truly free, we always begin by submitting to the demands of virtue, or the common good of our country, or especially the demands of loving God. As Our Lord has said, *If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love (Jn. 15.10).* It is in submitting to God's commandments that we rise to love as He loves, and being free with His own infinite freedom.

Today's feast of Pentecost speaks to us of this ultimate freedom of God. As Christ says of the Holy Spirit, and of what happens to us when united to Him: *The wind blows where it wills, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know whence it comes or whither it goes; so it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit (Jn 3.8).*

This is the freedom we are ultimately made for, not simply of a creature who can flourish in this limited world of matter, but of a creature who has become part divine, sharing in the divine nature, rising above this material world through the gift of immortality in Christ, and finding all the limitations of this world fade away in the infinite expanse and beauty of the heavenly kingdom.

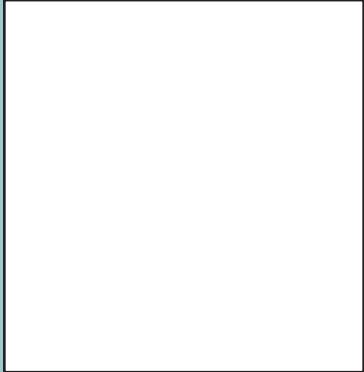
