## Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

Many people look at the Solemnity of the Ascension as that celebration when we recall Jesus' departure for heaven after his Resurrection. And while we trust scripture and through Faith believe that this event did happen, the feast that we celebrate on Sunday is so much more than that; and it's unfortunate that the United States bishops consented to move the day from its original Thursday to the following Sunday.

While I don't know for certain what motivated the bishops to move various feast days from their traditional dates to the "closest" Sunday (e.g., Epiphany, Ascension, Corpus Christi), in my eyes it's a bit of a tragedy. From our perspective it appears that they were trying very hard to accommodate the fact that the United States is a large territory. Getting to Mass for many even just once weekly was a real hardship. Unlike in Europe, where parish churches appeared every few blocks, here our churches are often miles (or more) from the next one. In the 19th and early 20th centuries getting to church was simply too difficult for individuals and nigh impossible for families.

These days we benefit from cars and other modes of transportation to get us from place to place. Aside from the recent rise in fuel costs, which have changed our mobility habits, it's not too terribly difficult to get to church. So, why don't the bishops move these feast days back? Again, I don't have the answer. From my perspective, the movement of these feast days dilutes the importance of the Faith in our lives. The shifting of Holy Days and the cancelation of Holy Days of Obligation if they are adjacent to Sunday seem to feed this impression.

In reality, we should be eager to get to church—the more opportunities the better. For if we desire to go to church in the way we want (and get) the material things in our lives, then we will have truly shown our love for Christ. Do we adapt our lives to the Church? Or, do we adapt the Church to our lives? I'm pretty certain I know what Christ would want.

Blessings to you all this Ascension Season.
