Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

The month of May is traditionally associated with Mary, the Mother of God, and is often referred to as the "Month of Mary." It is considered a time of spiritual renewal and growth, and a time for us Catholics to honor and show devotion to Mary, our Mother. This devotion has been present in the Church since the Middle Ages, and finds its meaning from the book of Isaiah, chapter 11, verse 1: "A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit." This verse is a prophetic reference to the Messiah, who would come from the lineage of Jesse, the father of King David. The "shoot" and "branch" in the verse are believed to represent the coming of the messiah who would bring salvation and establish a new kingdom. This prophecy was fulfilled with the birth of Jesus Christ, who was born in the lineage of Jesse and David. It relates to the Month of Mary through the idea of the "Branch" that will bear fruit. Since Mary is often referred to as the "Mystical Rose" and the "Mother of the Church," her role in salvation history was to be the branch that will bear fruit and bring new life. So Mary is seen as bringing forth the Savior of the world, Jesus Christ.

This Sunday, May 7th, before the 9 AM Mass, we will have a May Crowning, a popular devotion here at Holy Rosary. It involves placing a crown of flowers at the shrine of our Lady of the Rosary, often accompanied by a procession and the singing of a Marian hymn. Our youth choir will sing and the children will place bouquets to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary. The crowning symbolizes Mary's queenship and her role as the Mother of God and the Mother of the Church.

The May Crowning is also a reminder of Mary's virtues, such as her humility, purity, and obedience to God, and to grow in these virtues. To develop the virtue of humility, we can strive to be aware of our limitations and weaknesses, and to acknowledge our need for God's grace and mercy. We can also seek to serve others, without seeking recognition or praise for our actions. To grow in purity of heart, we can strive to develop the virtue of chastity and cultivate a deep respect for the dignity of every human person. Jesus tells us: "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God." (Matthew 5:8) To develop the virtue of obedience, we can strive to discern God's will for our own lives and to follow it with trust and faithfulness, even when it is difficult or goes against our own desires. Throughout the month of May, let us honor Mary and deepen our devotion to her, to reflect on her role in salvation history, as well as to ask for her intercession and help us to grow in these virtues. Let us pray the Rosary each day, and with Mary as our guide, meditate on the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.
