Dear Parishioners:

Blessings to you all. I have just returned from two back-to-back retreats. The first was my annual, canonical retreat—a time that each and every priest and religious is obliged to take for spiritual and physical renewal. I went to a Benedictine monastery, one that I have now been visiting for over 20 years. It was edifying for me to experience all the liturgical actions of the Mass and the Divine Office without being in the slightest way responsible for any of it. It's a real treat for me and one that brings me great joy. Yet, it always makes me anxious to return to ministry.

The second retreat was an extraordinary convocation for all the priests in the Archdiocese of Portland. Because it was local (just down in Happy Valley), we Dominicans were able to spend each night in our priory as well as celebrate the early morning Masses. This particular retreat was less about spiritual renewal, and more about fraternity within the presbyterate—something that has been missing in the lives of diocesan priests for years. It was great getting to spend time with other priests in the area, including other Dominicans in the Archdiocese.

I would like to thank Fr. Augustine Hilander, OP, for coming down from our Dominican parish in Seattle just to cover weekday confessions and noon Masses while the rest of us were attending the conference. I will be returning the favor in Seattle later this month when they go on their own. This is one of the benefits of belonging to a religious order. We know each other and we can provide assistance to each other, in fraternity and in charity. We offer the fruits obtained to those whom we minister.

On May 16 many of our children will be making their first communion at the 9:00a Mass. While this is a fantastic witness for all of us, and one that signifies the continuing renewal of our Faith from generation to generation, we do expect a full house under COVID limits. So that we do not have to impose signup limits I would ask that if you aren't directly related, perhaps you can switch to another Mass. This will greatly relieve those to whom the threat of spread is very real (e.g., those who have high-risk relatives).

Lastly, and not least, we celebrate Mother's Day on Sunday, May 9th. While this is not a liturgical event, we can never forget the role that mothers have in our own formation. Remember to communicate your love and gratitude to your mother, either in person, by telephone, or through prayer.
