Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

We are not only responsible for our own anger, but also for the anger of others. Thus says Saint John Cassian (AD 360 – 435) in his Sixteenth Conference of his *Conferences*. Cassian was responsible for bringing Christian monasticism to Europe after spending time at monasteries in Palestine and the Egyptian desert. Both Saint Dominic and Thomas Aquinas read Cassian for spiritual reading—he comes with the highest recommendation.

Saint Cassian observes that some monks think they are patient when they respond to an irritated brother with bitter silence or some other mocking gesture. According to Cassian, such a response does not cohere with Christian charity, because these monks did not take the available steps to sooth the anger of their brother to prevent his further sin. On the contrary, they riled him up through derision and a mocking silence.

Charity demands that we do not unjustly injure others out of anger. Charity also demands that we sooth the anger of another when possible or at least refrain from unnecessarily increasing it. The demand to not provoke anger in our neighbor whenever possible derives from our obligation to seek the spiritual good of our neighbor which immoderate anger ruins. Sometimes handling conflicts in a healthy way requires confrontation, which can provoke anger. The point is not to cause anger without reason and to sooth it whenever possible.

These demands of charity have an application far beyond the walls of the monastery. They even apply to our current political controversies.

Agitating and riling people up is not consistent with Christian charity, whether at political rallies or in debates over social media. We must have solicitude for the spiritual welfare of others regardless of their political views. It is wrong to inflame their anger with our own immoderate speech regardless of whether they are Democrat or Republican.

Of course, we need to speak the truth on important and controversial political issues, but we should speak with great moderation and caution. We should be aware that immoderate speech and polemics could induce sinful anger in our neighbor and lead them to sin or even towards complete spiritual ruin.

We must reconcile with our brothers and sisters before we offer spiritual sacrifices at the altar (Matthew 5:23-24). As Saint John Cassian comments, Jesus does not specify whether those having something against us are doing so reasonably. We must also seek to reconcile with those who are angry at us unreasonably. The most obvious way is to speak with that person and seek reconciliation. However, if this is not possible, we can at least exercise friendship for that person by praying for them, making sacrifices for them, and above all seeking their sanctification and happiness.

A good practice is to offer a day of prayer and fasting for the sanctification of that person. To call to mind their good qualities and attempt to see their virtues despite their bad qualities. If we notice apparent bad qualities, we can ask God to either correct our perception of them or replace those bad qualities with good qualities.

#### ADVENT DEVOTIONS: RORATE CAELI MASSES

December 3, 10, and 17 | 6:00 AM

The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn. On December 3 and December 10 these Masses will be celebrated according to the Dominican Rite at 6:00 AM. There will be a reception in Siena Hall following the Mass on December 3rd only. The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8: "Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes..." (Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Savior.) The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. Because it is a votive Mass in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, white vestments are worn instead of Advent violet. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ. On December 17, the 6:00 AM candlelit Dominican Rite Mass will be celebrated for Ember Saturday in Advent. The 8:00 AM Saturday Masses will be celebrated as usual.
