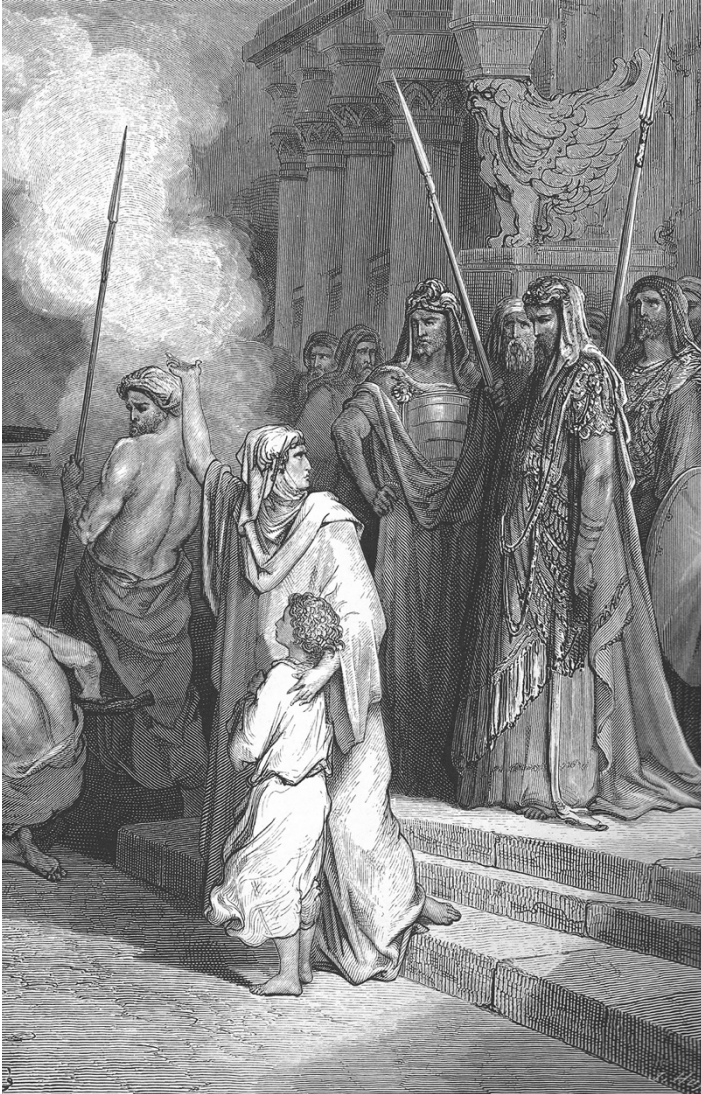

*Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,*

We are now in the month of November when we especially pray for the souls in purgatory, an important act of mercy revealed in Catholic teaching throughout the centuries.

St. Thomas, in explaining this teaching, speaks of how the venial sins we have as we leave this life are the reason for us being in purgatory. Some of these venial sins, because we especially clung to them in this life, have sunk their roots deeply within the soul. So, he says, some souls will be punished longer in purgatory than others, in so far as their affections were the more deeply immersed in venial sins (Meditations for Every Day 468). It is simply what happens to our souls when we give in to self-love, and the healing of that self-love that can only take place in the purifying fire of Divine Love.

So, the Church very wisely and mercifully has established this entire month of November to pray for our dead, giving us this important reminder, lest we forget or think little of the desperate help these souls need, or the important duty we have to pray especially for our family and friends, having the Holy Mass offered for them, and obtaining indulgences for them.

In fact, from November 1st to 8th a plenary indulgence can be obtained for a soul in purgatory by visiting a cemetery and praying for the faithful departed. Along with these prayers, one fulfills the usual requirements: confession two weeks before or after the visit, Holy Communion for departed, prayers for Pope Francis, and breaking all attachment to sin, even venial sin. If not visiting a cemetery, one can always obtain a plenary indulgence through reading scripture for a half an hour, or praying before the Blessed Sacrament for the same amount of time. Considering how simple these practices are, how eager we should be to come to the help of our deceased family and friends! God has enabled us, through plenary indulgences, to obtain for them immediate release from purgatory.

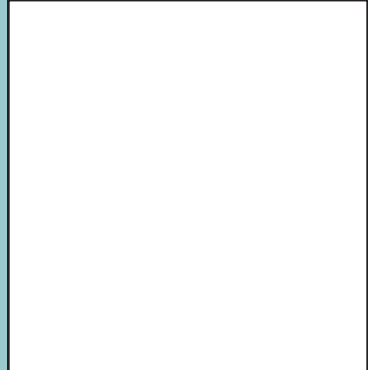
