Dear Parishioners:

This past week we celebrated the Solemnity of All Saints on Monday (November 1st). It is a Holy Day of Obligation. As is the custom of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), whenever a Holy Day of Obligation that isn't Christmas or the Immaculate Conception falls on either Monday or Saturday, then the precept to attend Mass on that day is abrogated (i.e., the faithful are not required to assist at Mass on those days). Why the Bishops agreed to this is confounding since they decreed it only in 1992. While it might have made sense in an era prior to good transportation options, it seems merely to capitulate to a tendency of laziness on the part of both the clergy and the faithful.

We here at Holy Rosary have been emphasizing that if the faithful are capable of attending Mass, then they should do so, even if the day is not obligatory. During the week, we typically have four options for Mass on Holy Days. In the case of Monday, there were Masses at 6:00a, 7:00a, noon, and 7:00p. In all of our Masses, there was a noticeable uptick in attendance, so much so that we had to employ more resources to account for the swell in numbers.

This is good news indeed. For while law gives us guidelines in what we ought to do, our intentionality should never be because of the law, but because of the thinking behind the law. Both Moses and Jesus stated emphatically that God is to be the focus of our attention and love. Assisting at Mass is the primary way of doing this. What message do we convey when we are relieved that we "don't have to go to Mass"? It's akin to saying that we don't need to see our loved ones because we don't have to. It just isn't done.

When we come to Mass simply because we want to be in the presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, or to worship the God who loves us, then we've transitioned to a new level of Faith. The graces that flow are immeasurable.
