Dear Parishioners:

Two weeks ago I gave a presentation on Sacred Music at our monthly *Drinks with Dominicans* event. Sacred Music is a pretty broad topic so I focused mainly on the music that the Church prescribes for use during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Even then it's a large area because historical development has had a 2,000 year history with several major shifts in style.

That said, the word *sacred* by definition means set apart, meaning that for liturgical purposes *sacred music* is uniquely devoted to the practice of worship of our Triune God, and should never sound like, appear like, or in be in ways be related to (and thus confused with) secular or popular music. We here at Holy Rosary have always held this line, which for a variety of reasons is not always popular with modern Catholics. This is perhaps one motivation for people to drive great distances for Sunday Mass. One instantly knows the power of music, setting the tone that is required of us in our worship.

Archbishop Sample recognizes what the Church asks and even published a pastoral letter titled, *Sing a New Song to the Lord* to the people of Western Oregon. Many people have never heard of this document, which is a shame (and a bit of a scandal). But as the Ordinary of our Archdiocese, the Archbishop is responsible for the teaching of both Faith and Morals, regulating practices where necessary. I encourage everyone to read this, which can be found on our website at holyroarypdx.org/sacredmusic. Every Catholic ought to know what's expected of them, not because there are a plenitude of rules, but because we want to give our very best to the God who loves us.
