Dear Parishioners:

Most parishes go into a bit of a hiatus in the summer. While they continue to celebrate Masses and sacraments such as baptisms and weddings, other routine events such as catechetical instruction, lectures, and community activities usually take a break. For us here at Holy Rosary, this past season was hardly a rest. We upped the program, introducing pilgrimages, community activities, and processions. Our parishioners responded wonderfully at our July Come and See weekend by offering to volunteer. As we have since moved into the more traditional academic year, one thing has become clear: we need help coordinating those volunteers.

While we priests are the only individuals that can confect the sacraments, it is really through the kindness, energy, and efforts of our parishioners that can most effectively bring the Church community together. It is in this way that we can participate more fully in life that Jesus laid out for us. The sacraments draw people in, but it is a sense of common purpose on the part of the laity, the desire to build each other up, the willingness to encourage each other, and the outpouring of love that we show to each other, that reinforces our Faith.

As I've said many times from the pulpit, we cannot afford to be only Sunday churchgoers. Yes, we are fulfilling an obligation that the Church lays out; it is merely a minimum. Unless we can live the Christian life daily, embrace Jesus' commandments, and form our children in this manner, then we should not be surprised if our Faith doesn't stick, either when the going gets tough, or when our children grow up and are lured by the material world.

Right now I'm in need of coordinators that can help facilitate events on a regular basis. Even the task of organizing roles at Mass (e.g., serving, reading, and ushering) have administrative overhead. While I can provide training, retreats, and reflections on these jobs, I can't do it all alone. Please let me know if you can provide the parish some of the more immediate human resources. This is not merely a one-time pledge, but really a regular commitment, a commitment that boasts huge rewards, even heavenly rewards.
