## Dear Parishioners:

This weekend (10/16 and 10/17) we have Rev. Br. Joseph Selinger, OP visiting us from our house of formation in Oakland, California, St. Albert's. This past spring, along with his classmates, he was ordained a transitional deacon and next year, God willing, they will all be ordained to the priesthood. As many of you will remember, Br. Joseph spent his residency year at Holy Rosary back in the academic year of 2017/2018. So, in a way, it's a homecoming.

As a deacon he will preach all of our Sunday Masses (including the 5:30p Saturday Vigil). And while it's nice for him to be able to preach at our liturgies, the big reason he's here is to promote awareness of the financial needs of forming the students. The Western Dominican Province (of which Holy Rosary is but one of its many ministries) receives no financial support from any of the bishops, and as such it is up to us to educate and form the young men who are responding to Jesus' call to religious life and particularly to the priesthood. It's a long haul and usually takes eight years! This is why we depend on parishioners and other benefactors to help us during this our *Annual Student Appeal*.

As a scholarly order, our education does not end with ordination. Many of us go on for further studies, perhaps to acquire a doctorate in theology or philosophy. If we are to succeed in our mission of *Salvation of Souls*, then we must always strive to preach the Truth of the Gospels. This is a daunting undertaking, one that is often counter-cultural. It is also expensive. Please join us in this appeal by prayerfully giving to this cause. You can find leaflets in the pews, in the church vestibules, and also in the parish office. Holy Rosary parishioners have been generous in the past, but as you are all aware, costs in every category have risen alarmingly. What is certain is that any men who staff our humble parish come from our student ranks. Your help can get them here.
