Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

In the *Summa Theologiae*, St. Thomas Aquinas writes that "the Eucharist is the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend" (*STh* III, 73,3c). This sacrament is raised up to be above all the other sacraments of the Catholic Church as the perfection from which the other sacraments stem. So if we desire to grow in the spiritual life, then one of the best means to achieve it is committing ourselves to a Eucharistic holy hour. Pope St. John Paul II said that "our communal worship at Mass must go together with our personal worship of Jesus in Eucharistic adoration in order that our love may be complete." So it is a gift and a privilege to love and adore our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Before the COVID pandemic, Holy Rosary Church had the beautiful tradition of daily adoring the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament on weekdays after the noon Mass until 7:30 pm. We now have daily Eucharistic adoration from 12:30-2:30 pm, and on Wednesday evenings from 7 - 8 pm. In the near future, I would like to extend daily adoration to 4:30 pm. For this to happen, I'm appealing to all friends and parishioners of Holy Rosary to consider signing up for a Holy Hour.

If you would like to sign up, visit holyroarypdx.org/adoration, or starting on Sunday, October 30th, after the 5:30 pm Saturday evening Mass, and Sunday after 7, 9, & 11 am Masses, there will be a table in Siena Hall with a couple of parishioners present to help answer any questions you might have regarding Holy Hour. A common question asked by parishioners is "what do we do at adoration?" For some, Eucharistic adoration is an opportunity to spend quiet prayer time with our Lord Jesus. For others, they may use that time to meditate or contemplate on the mysteries of the Rosary, reflect on scripture, discern God's will in life, or make an examination of conscience before going to confession. In short, it is time spent with the Lord in the Eucharist.

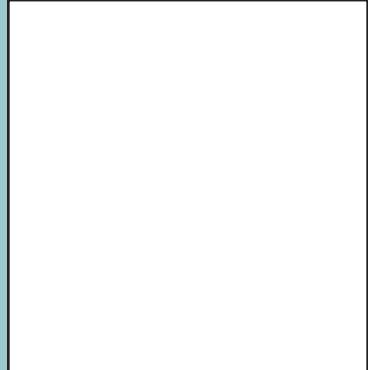
