September is in Ordinary Time, represented in green, the color of hope for eternal salvation in heaven. Because it is in Ordinary Time, the liturgy of this month does not focus on any particular mystery of Christ, but contemplates the life of Christ in all its aspects. We follow the footsteps of Christ recounted in the Gospels, focus on his teachings and parables, and look to the saints to imitate and become faithful disciples of Christ.

During this month, we celebrate in particular the following memorials and feasts: Birthday of Our Lady (September 8), the Exaltation of the Cross (September 14), Our Lady of Sorrows (September 15), Saint Andrew Kim and his companions (September 20), Saint Matthew (September 21), Saints Cosmas and Damian (September 26), Saint Pius of Pietrelcina (September 23), Saint Vincent de Paul (September 27), Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael (September 29), and Saint Jerome (September 30).

Since the 16th century, there has been a tradition that the devotion for the month of September will be based on a certain feast that is prominent in the month. The highlight of September is the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross and the memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. All of Mary's sorrows from Simeon's prophecy were revealed in her utter agony at the foot of the Cross.

With Mary, let us pray that "honoring how the Blessed Virgin Mary suffered with her Son, we may complete in ourselves for the Church's sake what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ." (Prayer after Communion for the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows) - Fr. Peter Do, OP
