This week I had the privilege of being the representative of the Priory of Holy Rosary (Portland) to travel to San Francisco to witness the vestition, or reception of the habit, of Br. John Paul Puschautz. Recall that he spent a couple of months here this past summer and helped re-ignite some of our ministries. Br. John Paul and three other men received the Dominican habit during the Office of Compline on Thursday, September 2nd and thus began their novitiate. After getting used to seeing him in the grey habit of the Community of St. John, it's quite a shock (and a pleasant one at that) to see him in our formal black and whites.

The novitiate is a time of separation from the world, and one where a friar learns about our ways, particularly in prayer and contemplation. It can be quite beautiful, but it can also be full of challenges. I ask you to say a Hail Mary (now would be a good time) for Br. John Paul, that he is able to persevere. Religious life is not easy and being in a religious order does not make us holy. However, it does provide a wonderful vehicle for us to respond to God's will in our lives. That, on the other hand, will make us holy.

As many of us know, we Dominicans don't just staff Holy Rosary Parish, we actually retain the rights to the parish as an oratory. This gives us a unique position within the Archdiocese
