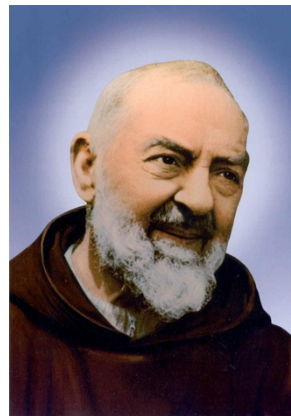

Dear Parishioners:

During the liturgy of a priestly ordination, there is a time when the *ordinandi* (those to be ordained) lay prostrate before the sanctuary. While they are down, the rest of the congregation calls upon the heavenly help and prayers of the saints. It is called the Litany of Saints. Included in it are Mary, Joseph, John the Baptist, Peter, Paul, and the rest of the Apostles, the early martyrs, Dominic and Francis, the holy angels and some others. You know, the heavy hitters and all stars of the Church. After they are invoked, the *ordinandi* get some say in the Litany of Saints by asking the help and prayers of their own patron saints and those for whom they have a devotion.



When I was ordained a priest, I asked that St. Pius of Pietrelcina be added to my Litany. His name is a mouthful. But fortunately, he has an easily recognized nickname: Padre Pio.



Padre Pio (St. Pius of Pietrelcina), September 23: Priest, Mystic, Stigmatist.

Some notable history of Padre Pio: Padre Pio was known for his no-nonsense and sometimes confrontational style with his penitents. Some said that he could smell the sins of those who confessed to him. Moreover, when the penitent tried to hide his sins, Padre Pio would respond with

statements of fact about the yet-unconfessed-sins.

Bilocation. Literally seen by witnesses with him in different places at the exact same moment, Padre Pio's gift of appearing at two places simultaneously became so commonplace that his assistant, when asked about Pio's whereabouts, would simply respond, "He's on bilocation."

A young Polish priest by the name of Karol Wojtyla came to see Padre Pio in 1947. Fr. Karol knelt at the confessional where Padre Pio was. And in that moment something mystical and prophetic happened. Padre Pio knew the future of this priest before him and so he knelt down as well and said to Fr. Karol that he would one day be the pope. Indeed, that happened. Karol Wojtyla became Pope John Paul II in 1978. Fittingly, St. John Paul II canonized Padre Pio in 2002.

Padre Pio, pray for us!

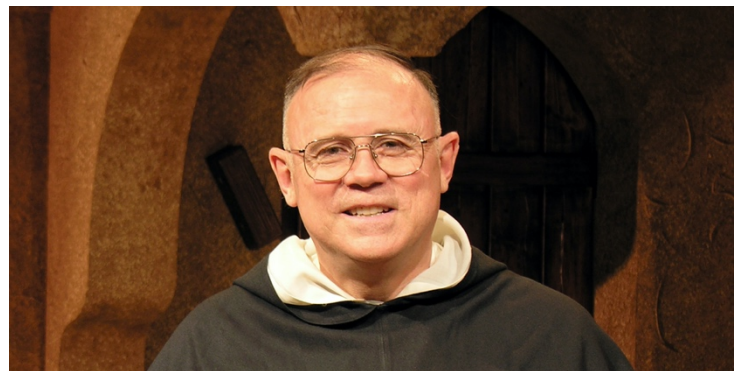
