Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

Christ in our Gospel for this 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time gives His parable of Lazarus and the rich man. There Our Lord shows how offensive to God is the neglect of the poor. So much so that it leads the rich man to eternal punishment, while Lazarus who for years was ignored by him is welcomed into eternal life. Our Lord in this and other passages places almsgiving as one of the most important of Christian practices. *What you did for the least of my brethren, you did for me.*

We also have Our Lord in the passage alluding to fasting, in an indirect way, which the rich man also neglected to do. He dined sumptuously each day, neither almsgiving nor fasting part of the rich man's life. Jesus not saying so, but the implication is clear that for those who hope to pass into the heavenly kingdom, fasting (for those who are able) and almsgiving must be among their spiritual practices.

This past week in the Dominican Rite, using the older liturgical calendar, we had the days of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving called Ember Days. Four times a year, in each of the four seasons, a Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday were set aside for doing penance and acts of mercy. The practice was done in Rome certainly by the time of Pope Leo the Great in the 400's, who mentions it in his sermons: *...hence we warn you, beloved, in fatherly affection, to make this winter fast fruitful to yourselves by bounteous alms, rejoicing that by you the LORD feeds and clothes His poor, to whom assuredly He could have given the possessions which He has bestowed on you, had He not in His unspeakable mercy wished to justify them for their patient labor, and you for your works of love* (Sermon XIX on the fast of the Tenth Month).

We usually think of generosity to the poor and fasting as devotional practices for Lent, but the point of the Ember Days was to keep these practices always before us. Although the fasting of Ember Days is no longer required, certainly their spirit we should strive to practice throughout the year: the moderation in food, self-denial, and reaching out to the poor that are at the foundation of Christian life.
