

Dear Holy Rosary Friends and Families,

It is great to have the opportunity to greet everyone again and give some reflections for the parish bulletin. I am settling in to life at Holy Rosary after 18 years away. One of the additions I notice to the liturgy of past years is the veneration of relics. There are reliquaries on the altar and those brought out for special occasions. A well-chosen time to make them available. Good to remind ourselves through use of relics, that in this increasingly adverse, anti-Christian, West-coast culture, we have a vast spiritual support group in heaven. To remember as well how their concern and prayers have a greater effect on us as we honor their physical remains. The more we reach out to them through their relics, the deeper our connection with them becomes. The bond of charity unites us more perfectly, and the more our souls open up to the help they long to give.

So, as we may seem hemmed in by Black Lives Matters supporters all around, our celebration of Holy Mass and veneration relics opens us up to a much larger, heavenly community of friends and powerful intercessors. Just to name the saints whose relics are on the altar: Ss. Blaise, Gregory the Great, Anthony of Padua, Vincent de Paul, Elizabeth Ann Seton, Pius X, as well as Ss. Dominic, Martin de Porres, Juan Macias, and Bl. Imelda Lambertini. Because of these relics prominently displayed, we can be assured of their special intercession for our needs here at Holy Rosary. We should have no doubts about their friendship, powerful influence, and readiness to help. Another remarkable relic brought out occasionally, and one which is dear to us Dominicans, is a fragment from the Crown of Thorns. Early Christian authors testify to its veneration in the first centuries of Christianity. Eventually it was brought from the Holy Land to Constantinople. Then later, St. Louis IX, King of France, whose feast day was August 25, was able to bring the Crown to Paris in 1239. He enlisted two Dominicans to bring the relic from Constantinople, and then himself led the procession from the French boarder to Paris. He built the magnificent royal chapel, Sainte Chapelle, to house it. Much later it was moved to Notre Dame Cathedral, and fortunately rescued from the tragic fire of 2019.
