*Celebrating Mass at Thomas Lake in the Indian Heaven Wilderness of Washington State*

Many of you might have been wondering where I've been this past week. While I did celebrate the early Sunday morning Mass, I was pretty much gone all the following week. In point of fact, I was with the Boy Scouts on their annual 50-mile backpacking trip, celebrating the sacred mysteries wherever we went. This year marks the third year that I've been their chaplain and I'm extremely proud of their accomplishment.

These days forming boys has never been more difficult. Social pressures, academic pressures, and even sports pressures have whittled away valuable time traditionally allocated between fathers and their sons. While a backpacking trip is only one of 52 weeks of the year, it is invaluable. An undertaking of this nature is a kind of rite-of-passage, a journey with a fixed beginning and a fixed end. Commitment, responsibility, and follow-through become mandatory virtues because the wilderness is unpredictable and unforgiving. There is no easy-out; there is no bailing; there are no shortcuts, especially in the face of adversity. These young men must learn how to cope, use their wits, and more importantly, learn how to deal with the consequences of their own decisions. This year, with inclement cold and rain, we saw these consequences play out first hand.

Yet, despite these hardships, each boy is to be commended for an accomplishment that few even attempt. It will be something that someday they will be able to recount to their own boys and inspire them to gain skills that no classroom or textbook could ever teach them. Every parent should look into this program for their boys.
